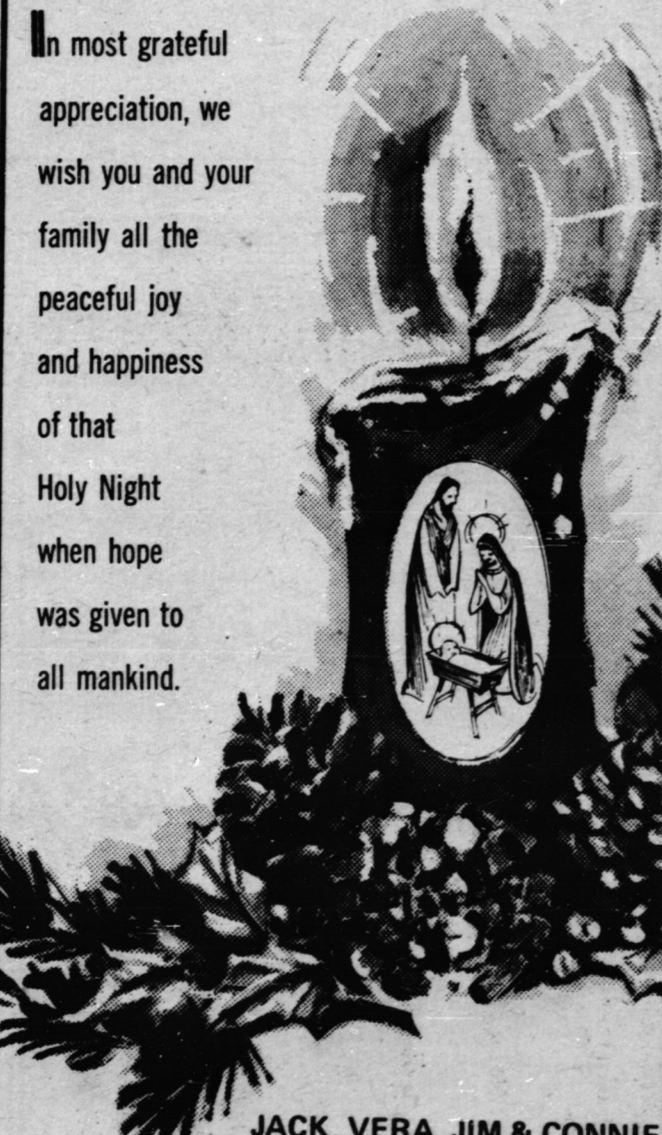
### Lions Meet

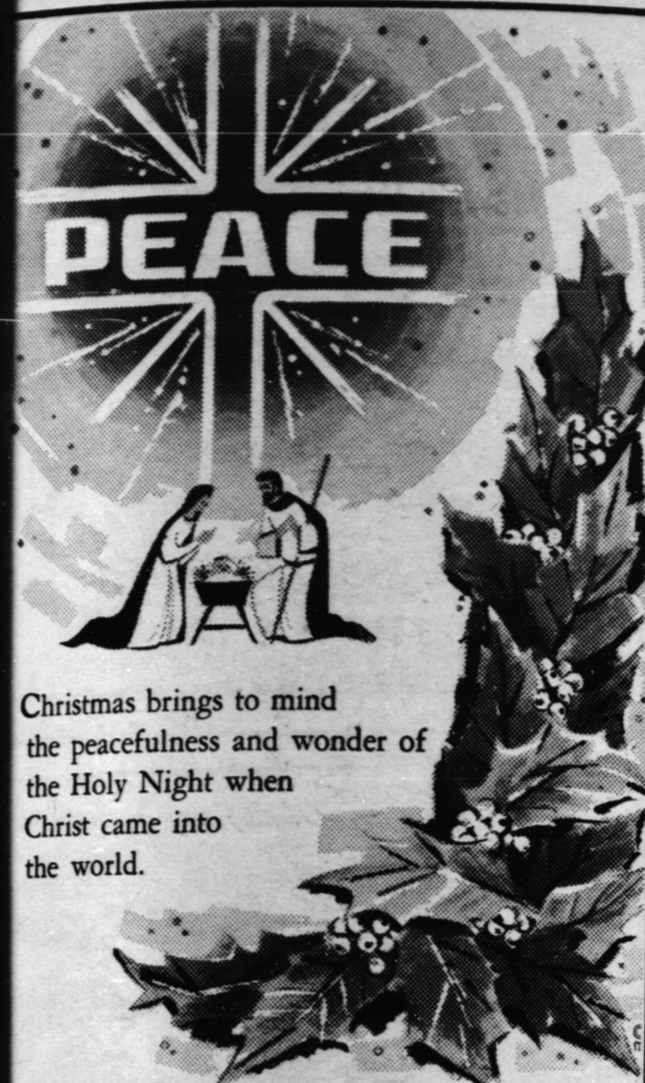
### Selkirk News
