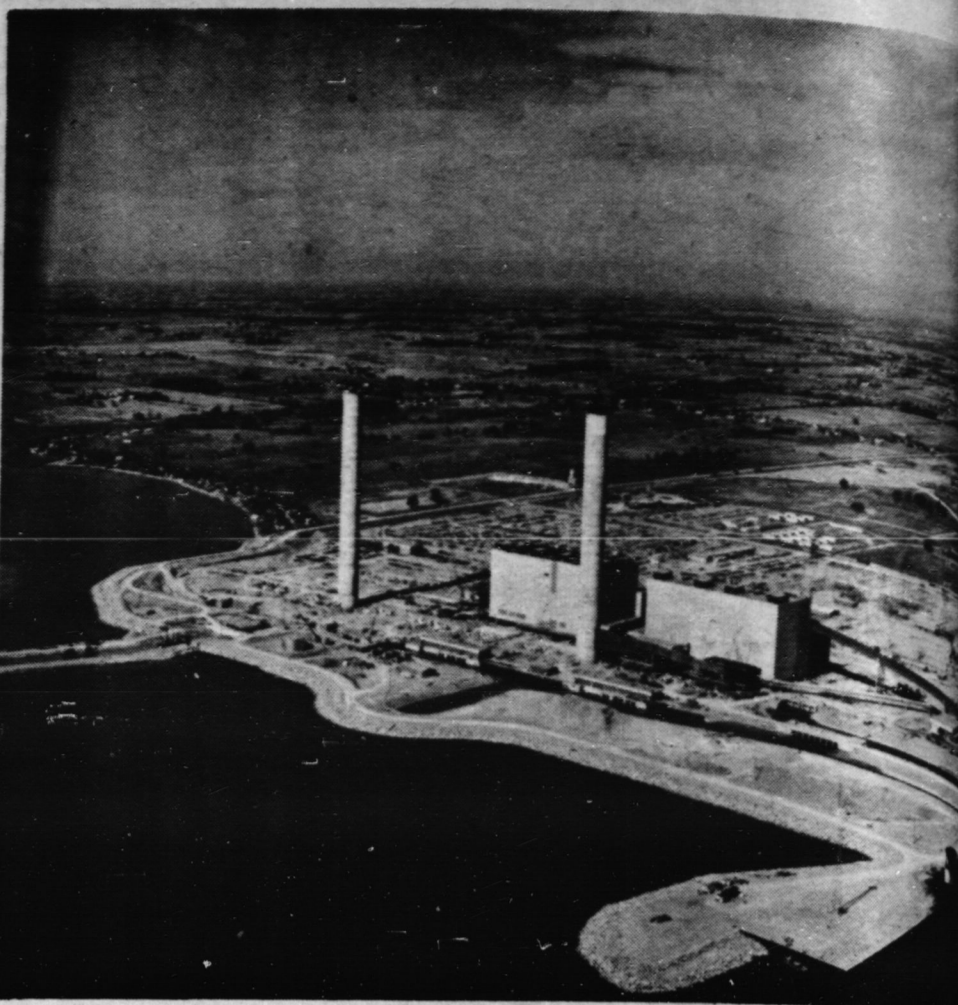


Tidings of Gladness and Joy

body. A yellow streamer complete with number and Ontario Department Lands and Forests identification remains on the outside of the fish. The crew retrieved three fish which had been tagged before in this netting. The numbers of their tags were recorded so that comparisons with initial information is possible. More than 2,000 fish have been tagged by the "Nanticoke Project" since June of this year.

The project is also interested in the smaller "fishlife" of the lake which may serve as food for the species being marked. Samples of these forms are collected in a bottle at the end of a surface net which is towed at a slow rate behind the vessel. Samples, in small plastic bags, are collected and preserved in formaldehyde for detailed examination and identification laboratory. Information collected from the study is noted daily. During the winter, Dr. Kelso will analyze remaining samples and study the growing file of measurements of fish size and age, numbers of small life forms, life patterns and movement, temperature readings of the lake waters, and other information which Dr. Kelso and his staff consider important as they go along. The Research Branch of Lands and Forests also receive support from the Nanticoke Environmental Committee grant, and are involved in assessing zooplankton (a microscopic free-living aquatic animal) abundance and speciation. These small organisms are an important food of many animals, large and small (including fish) and are a major piece of the complex puzzle of Lake Erie.

The integration of information, descriptions and conclusions provided by all investigating agencies at the Nanticoke Environmental Committee should provide the ultimate key to the primary question of potential "thermal effect" changes to the aquatic community. Nanticoke G.S. will use 2,000,000 gallons of water a minute for cooling at full capacity; the water returns to Lake Erie with temperature increases between five and 15 degrees warmer than it was when taken from the lake bottom. Hydro scientists believe that all of this heat will be lost to the atmosphere within an area 10,000 feet long and 3,000 feet wide and the heat will not adversely affect aquatic life in the lake. Dr. Kelso and his crew will collect the data required to assess the effect, if any, on the life style of fish in the area bounded by Hoover Point and Long Point Bay. In the meantime, there appears to be no shortage of life in Lake Erie.

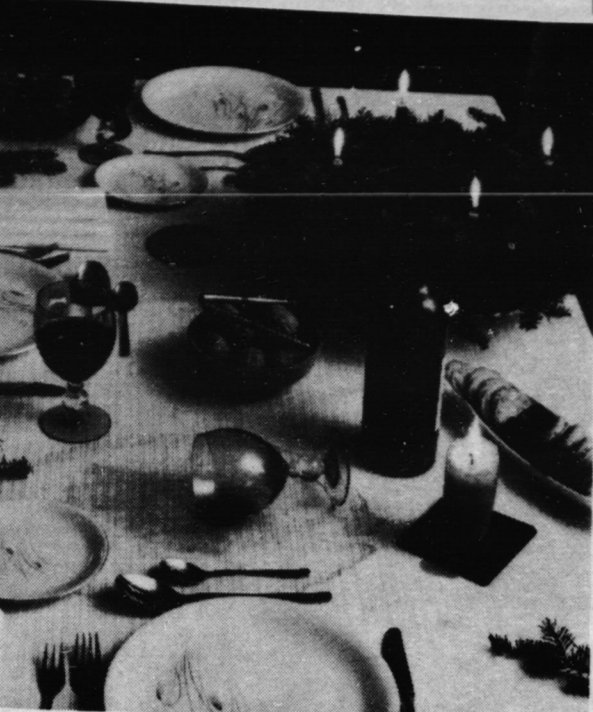
A Happy World-Wide Celebration

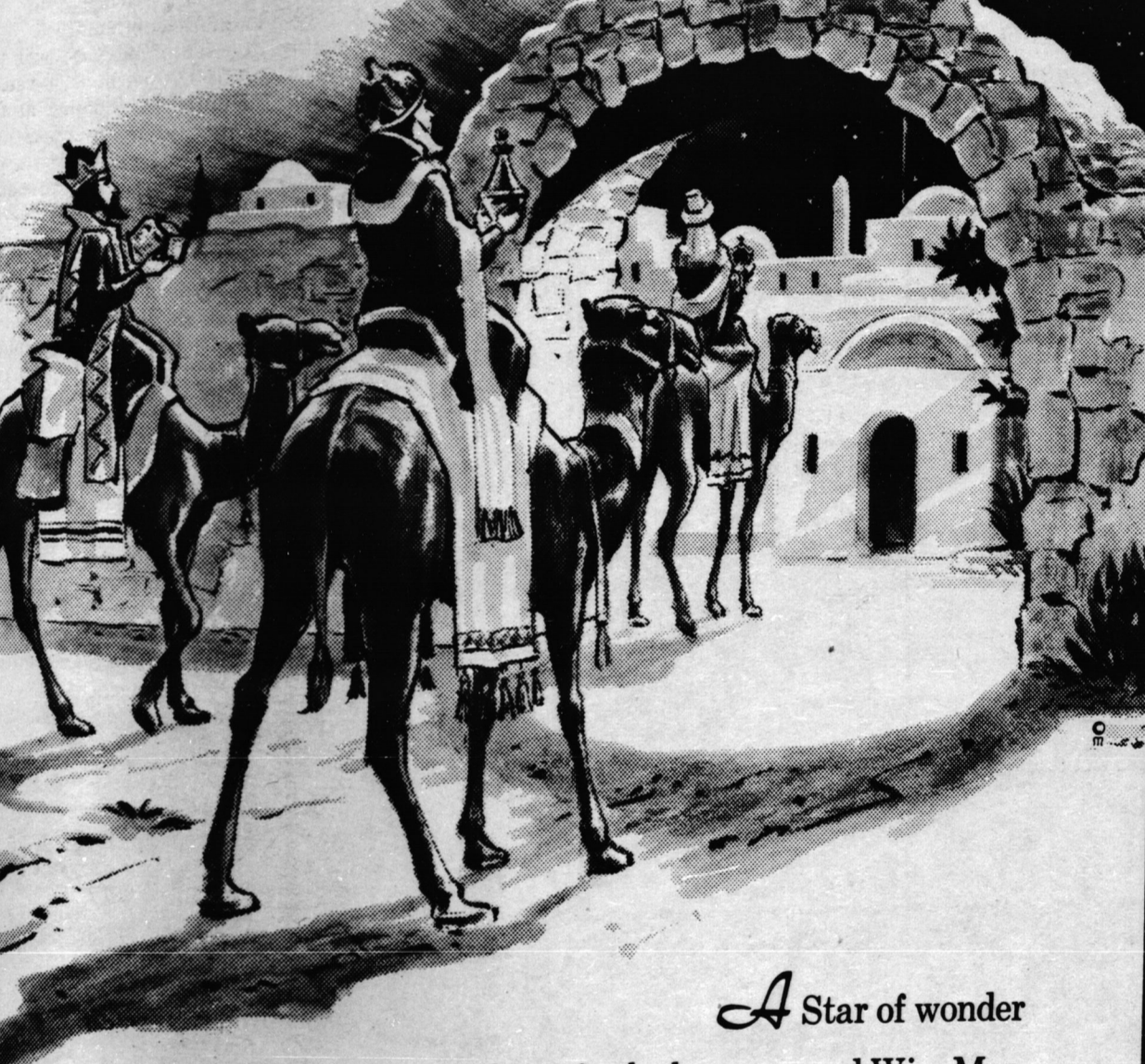

KEEPING YOUR CHRISTMAS CAREFREE

CHRISTMAS pudding, turkey, cranberry sauce, mince pies, the wine to wash them down, all illuminated by flickering candles, all the trappings for a great seasonal feast but they can leave your best damask cloth looking like a disaster area. Quick action, and a few simple rules will help you do a professional stain removing job, and leave you with the feeling that all the trouble you went to was really worth it. Wine and cranberry juice, considered near impossible stains can be removed from most fabrics if you attend to them soon enough. Prompt treatment is the key to success. When set by heat or age, they may be difficult or impossible to remove. The longer the stain remains on the fabric, the more chance it has to penetrate the fibres. Never launder or iron a stained article without pre-treatment. To pre-treat, simply wet stain with cold water and brush in a small amount of Borateem and let stand a few minutes before washing. Follow, by wash cycle and water temperature recommended for fabric. If stain is greasy, such as a turkey gravy, we suggest using Boraxo powder hand soap. Always note, that heat can set stains into the fibres, causing a permanent stain. For pre-treatment follow these three simple steps:
1. TESTING - Try a little of the stain removing agent on an inside seam to be sure the fabric and colour will not be damaged. Leave it for at least 15 minutes and give it a chance to penetrate.
2. BRUSH the stain away with a tapping action. A nail or toothbrush will do nicely. Hard rubbing may redistribute the soil to a larger area or damage the fibres.
3. LAUNDER the article with your favourite detergent. Here is a guide to removing some of the stains you may encounter this Christmas:
Wine, Alcoholic Beverages, Soft Drinks, Lipstick, Eggnog, Eggs, Green Vegetables: Wet stain with cool water. Brush on Borateem. Launder.
Gravy, Meat Juices, Fats, Oils, Grease, Salad Dressing, Mayonnaise: Wet stain with cool water. Brush on Boraxo powdered hand soap. Launder.
Candy: Soak in cool water. Launder in hot water.
Candle Wax: Scrape off excess wax with dull knife. Place stained area between 2 blotters or several thicknesses of paper towelling or facial tissues and press with warm iron. Repeat if necessary. If colour remains, brush with rubbing alcohol. Launder.
Coffee, Tea, Chocolate, Cocoa: Soak in cold water and brush with liquid detergent or detergent paste. Coffee and tea without milk or cream require soaking in Borateem and cool water overnight. Then brush with Borateem and launder.
