Haldimand County council is to be commended for stand it is taking in attempting to set up its own anning board apart from Norfolk County.

There has been strong feeling about the provincial overnment's proposal to establish a joint planning pard for the two counties and the current two-county udy that was launched by the then municipal affairs ister Darcy McKeough has been aiming at this goal nce its inception.

However, when the joint planning idea was roduced, the general feeling then was that the two unties would soon be experiencing an expolsion of nulation and industrial growth. With that in mind, a -county planning board, with the ultimate objective regional government was not only wise, but practical inking for the future.

Times have changed since 1969 and the past year has een one of particular economic hardship for many ampanies facing expansion. They have, in many cases ecided to hold off on expansion plans and to revitalize xisting facilities.

This has given the planners the time needed to fully plore all the possibilities for well control growth in the

Haldimand, which is particularly agricultural in scope, as heen naturally reluctant to jump into the industrial ream with Norfolk and had decided it would like to lan the county as a single unit, but would be willing to ave the same planner act as liasion with Norfolk

With little expectation that the Steel Company of anada will be getting its massive complex on Lake Erie t Nanticoke underway until about 1975, this gives the ounties all the time they need to adequately prepare for "industrial revolution."

County council will be taking on an enormous work oad if it is given the okay to act as the planning board. ut this may well be of great benefit in the years to ome when one way or another Norfolk and Haldimand re going to have to become bedmates in regional


