Federation News

How would egg producers like to market their eggs in the future? This is what the egg inquiry commission is trying to establish.

In June the Ontario Farm Products Marketing Board had planned a vote of egg producers. The vote was to be on a proposed production and marketing plan but suddenly the number of producers increased by approximately 30 per cent. This vote was cancelled since it was evident there would be many votes cast by people with little interest in the production of eggs.

A commission was established to examine the events that took place and also to hear submissions from producers in Ontario.

At the hearing held in London recently a producer with 37,000 birds said in his operation the cost of production is 22 cents a dozen. His average return is 24 cents per dozen with a net profit of two cents per dozen. He felt this is a satisfactory return and objected to any change in the egg industry.

On Jan. 5, 6, 7 at old City Hall, Court Room 35, third floor at 10 a.m., the commission will be holding hearings. This will be the last opportunity for Haldimand producers to make known their views.
