Increase Abilities

OAKVILLE, Ont. (CP) - "The Box," a simple but painstakingly prepared collection of objects whose shapes and textures stimulate the senses, could increase the perceptual abilities of handicapped children.

Designed by students at Sheridan College in Oakville, The Box, of which a few score prototypes exist, may receive federal government support.

A plastics chemist in the department of trade and commerce, A. Y. Renaud, discussed the creation with Stephen Hodgdon of Sheridan's school of design and has taken a unit to

show his superiors in Ottawa.

The project was conceived in August, 1969, by Mary Francis Haws, editor of Dot, magazine of the Canadian Braille Association. Each Sheridan design student submitted two objects, one both visual and tactile in appeal, the other in a soft material designed to evoke a multitude of images.

By handling objects in different combinations and sequences, many different sensations are experienced. Rubbing them produces sounds.

Four other schools, in West Germany, the United

States, Great Britain and France, contributed to the project.

Prototypes have been used in an Ontario Art Gallery travelling exhibit and tested by blind children. Everywhere they have had a successful reception.

Sheila Lamb, designer of the exhibit, and Mrs. Haws say they have received many letters - some in braille - from blind children expressing appreciation.

Various schools for the blind and foreign institutions have received The Box, but mass

production awaits a willing manufacturer.

"There aren't enough boxes to go around and the need is great," said Mrs. Haws.

Mr. Hodgdon estimated \$100,000 is needed to develop the full potential of The Box before beginning mass production. He hoped a manufacturer could be found who would advance the \$100,000 and produce the units.

Sighted children with perceptual handicaps receive another dimension of awareness from the box, since the objects together display a rainbow of colors.
