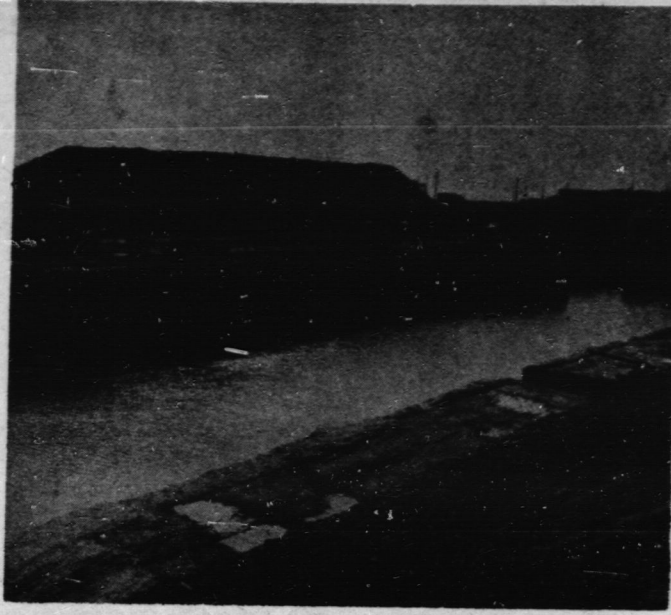

MAJOR DROP EDMONTON (CP) - A major drop in apartment building was responsible for almost half of the \$40 million reduction in construction in the city in 1970. A survey of city building records showed 125 permits were issued for apartment blocks containing 2,423 units with a total value of almost \$26 million. In 1969, 293 permits were issued for 6,937 units with a value of \$47 million.

Two Million Gallons Of Water

The channels for returning "cooling water" to Lake Erie are completed for the Nanticoke GS. At full capacity Nanticoke GS will use about 2,000,000 gallons of cooling water per minute. Sixty percent (60%) of the incoming water cools the steam condensers; the remaining forty percent (40%) is used to cool or "temper" the cooling water.

Water flow through eight large tunnels into a discharge channel where it mixes with cooler water pumped from the intake forebay. Water returning to the lake from the plant will be 5-15 degrees F., warmer than it was when it was originally taken from the lake bottom.
