Haldimand Children's Aid Annual Meeting

Jarvis Community Hall was the locale of the annual Children's Aid society meeting.

The Jarvis Women's Institute catered for the gathering serving a delicious roast beef dinner. While the attendance was not as large as usual it was noted that there was a large percentage of teenagers present, which was considered to be a step forward.

Reeve Austin of Jarvis welcomed the gathering and Warden Clayton Smith spoke briefly.

Abe Friesen of Dunnville represented the Alcohol and Drug Addiction society. Mr. Mainville of Toronto Welfare and Social Services Department showed a picture. Local director John MacGregor reported to those present on the year's work as follows: In 1970, about 63 percent of children discharged from care were reunited with their own parents, indicating the value of continuing case work with families even after crises, he said.

An accelerated home finding program last year resulted in a record of 43 adoption applications, and despite the society's unusual position of having no great need of foster homes. Thirteen applications are being processed to make homes available to other societies.
