## **BY-LAW NO. 1511**

OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WALPOLE Being a By-law to provide a Minimum Tax

HEREAS The Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1960, Chapter 49 and amendments thereto, provides as follows:

Section 538, subsection (1) - "The Council of any municipality may by by-law provide that where the sum of the taxes for which any person is chargeable in any year for municipal, school, local improvement and other purposes, on any real property assessed in one parcel-to the same owner would according to the assessment thereon be less than \$6.00, the sum of such taxes shall be deemed to be \$6.00 and shall be so entered on the collector's roll and the difference between the sum that would have been entered but for this Section and the sum of \$6.00, shall form part of the general funds of the municipality."

THAT where the sum of the taxes for which any person is chargeable in any year for municipal, school local improvement and other purposes, ipon any real property assessed in one parcel to he same owner would according to the assessment hereon be less than \$6.00, the sum of such taxes shall be deemed to be \$6.00 and shall be so intered on the collector's roll, and the difference between the sum that would have been entered out for this Section and the sum of \$6.00 shall form part of the general funds of the municipality.
