Ontario Federation of Agriculture management digest for December reports H. A. Olson who was speaking at the recent Canadian Agricultural Congress, told delegates of a federal government support program of \$423 million for Canada's agriculture this year.

Mr. Olson also compared this country's program to many other industrial nations. He said "In 1969 the federal government spent about \$350 a person employed in agriculture in Canada. This compares with \$625 in West Germany, \$980 in France, \$1,059 in Britain, \$1,287 in the United States and \$1,052 in Switzerland."

It seems to me the average of these food exporting countries have supported agriculture three times that of Canada. These countries because of this support are able to sell farm products on the world market at a price far below what is paid their farmers.

It has the affect of forcing Canadian farmers to compete on the world market with the treasuries of these countries.

I think it's time Canadian people got around to deciding whether or not we are going to continue to have an Agricultural industry in Canada.

In recent years we have seen the sugar beet industry leave Ontario. Many of the fruit and vegetable producers say they can no longer compete with imports. It surely is time people realized this will effect more than just the farmer.

In my opinion it is the responsibility of every person to give this matter serious consideration. Also make every effort to make sure their views are known.

If our people do not listen this is probably the time for some drastic measures.
