remainder would be offered to the processors.  
Mr. Sanford said the Board is apparently prepared to accept this increase of this dairy year, plus the new dairy year which commences April 1, 1971.  
Chairman of the NFU Dairy Committee, William Langdon declared the proposed price increases are entirely unsatisfactory to the majority of industrial milk producers.  
"The policy objective of the NFU is to obtain a minimum of \$1 increase in the base price of industrial milk," he said.  
"The announcement by the Board revealed that the price paid to fluid milk producers would increase from \$6.65 per cwt. to \$6.85 effective Feb. 1 of this year. An additional increase of 15 cents or more would take effect on Sept. 1, raising the price of that portion of the milk used for fluid purposes to at least \$7 per cwt.," said Mr. Langdon.  
The NFU official said it would appear that the increase in price to fluid producers being brought about in two stages gives the distributors the opportunity of increasing the price to consumers twice and putting the blame on the farmers both times.  
He said the fluid producer should have received a price increase equivalent to one cent a quart at this time (38 qt. in a cwt. of milk.)  
Mr. Langdon indicated the Union agreed with a price increase for these producers, but thought the price increase should have

been brought about in one stage.  
If the price had been raised to \$7.03 per cwt. on Feb. 1, it would have also assisted in bringing more pressure to bear which are obviously necessary in order to raise the price paid to industrial shippers to a satisfactory level.

## Lands And Forests

With the arrival of winter, we are reminded too often of the tragic accidents that have occurred at this time of year by persons going through the ice.  
With the coming of snowmobiles, the occurrence of lake crossings has increased for sport fishing or just general travel. Lakes and rivers form good natural playgrounds for these vehicles in an area that should not interfere with anyone either for traffic or noise conditions.  
Some care must be taken to avoid drowning by going through the ice. Beware of thawing and freezing conditions when crossing waterways. Check ice surfaces for slush as well as thickness before venturing onto it. Slush will stop you faster than deep snow. Your machine weighs anywhere from three hundred pounds up plus your weight. Make sure the ice will support you before risking your life and equipment.  
If you are uncertain and must cross, get two poles about ten to 12 feet long. Tie one at a right angle to the front of the machine, and one at a right angle to the back of the machine. If you should break through,

hearing the opening would be postponed.  
"The only time we were kept up to date with the problems they have encountered at the bridge was following an article published by a major Toronto newspaper.  
"We of Port Dover are the laughing stock of southwestern Ontario," he said.

## Japan Takes The Lead

In a world troubled by pollution of the sea, the air and the land, the Japanese islanders are doing great work. The Japanese Government recently launched a major anti-pollution campaign, and a special parliamentary session was called to consider a wide-ranging set of new laws.  
The session began in November and was expected

to last for most of December. The Government of Japan wants to beef up eight laws that already exist, and hopes to push through seven new bills to combat the growing problem.  
Pollution is choking many Japanese cities, fouling the air as well as the country's rivers and shoreline. Industries in Japan have been causing some of the world's worst river and coastal pollution.  
But the government is working hard to change things. The most controversial bill being suggested by some politicians demands jail sentences of up to three years, and heavy fines for industrial leaders whose companies cause dangerous pollution.  
Japan is hitting the wealthy tycoons where it hurts most. It will deprive them of their liberty if they fail to think first of the general public at large, the people's health and safety.  
The greed of many industrialists is to blame for

much of the world's pollution. Anti-pollution measures can be taken, and must be taken. But they cost money. In Japan, unless the industrial chiefs spend that money to make the country's air and waterways cleaner, they are now likely to end up behind bars.

**BASEBOARD HEAT FOR BIGGER ROOMS**  
If your rooms have a crowded appearance, perhaps it is because you must keep your furniture too far from the walls to avoid blocking old fashioned heating registers and radiators. A remedy, suggests the Canadian Hydronics Council, is to replace them with ankle-high hydronic (modern hot water) baseboard heating panels which permit full decorating freedom in addition to optimum comfort.
