REPORT

January 7 - Prov. Constables Q. Boon and K.R. Schaus arrested three persons in a car on the Indian Line West of Hagersville, with reference to a serious assault on an elderly person in the Simcoe area.

January 8 - A vehicle reported stolen from Brantford was recovered in Walpole Township.

Over half of the fatal snowmobile accidents in Ontario during the 1969-70 season occurred on public thoroughfares. Most of these fatalities were the result of collisions between snowmobiles and motor vehicles. In several incidents, snowmobiles ran into parked motor vehicles. Snowmobiles are designed to travel on snow but not on the hard-packed and icy surfaces frequently found on heavily-travelled roadways. Under these conditions a snowmobile is difficult to control, hard to stop or steer, a death-trap

for the operator and a menace to motor vehicle traffic. Snowmobilers should try to avoid public thoroughfares, heavily travelled by motor vehicles, even if their use is legalized. Approximately half of the accidents on public thoroughfares happened during hours of darkness. Keep in mind that the new Ontario regulations require motor vehicle drivers to have a license to legally operate a snowmobile on any public thoroughfare - even to cross it.

Officers investigated a total of 12 motor vehicle collisions, resulting in one fatality and three other persons injured.

Two snowmobile accidents were investigated, which resulted in injuries sustained to two persons. General occurrences investigated were: One break and enter, three thefts, one trespassing complaint and 16 requests for assistance.
