
- Passed a resolution approving a 52-lot subdivision off Parkview Road to be developed by Haldimand Building Products Ltd.

- Passed first and second reading on a bylaw to make an agreement with Ontario Water Resources Commission to make a municipal levy to finance water facilities in the west section.


- Passed a first and second reading for a bylaw to enter an agreement with OWRC to levy to finance sewer facilities for the west section of the village.
