In the morning, the boy could not be awakened. The autopsy showed that his blood was saturated with 52 percent carbon monoxide, given off by the smoldering charcoal.

The Ontario Safety League warns against the use of barbecues as heaters in tents or other enclosed areas and offers these tips to help recognize the symptoms of Carbon Monoxide poisoning: tightening across the forehead, throbbing headache, drowsiness, nausea and finally unconsciousness.
