pickerel, and several salmonoid species.

The nets used in this study are marked by three-foot buoys with blaze orange flags bearing "Lands and Forests." Avoidance of these nets by boats will, in addition to preventing boating accidents and damage, prevent damage to the nets and captured fish.

As well as the above-stated objectives, the project is concerned with assessing spawning areas, spawning success, and feeding habits in the immediate area. Use will be made of commercial fish and sport catches, since landings by these groups will further information on fishing success, growth, and mortality. Co-operation of all involved parties is necessary to obtain results of value to all the concerned agencies, industry, and the fishing public.

The public can become an important part of this project. Tag information, including tag number, location of catch, and date, may be forwarded to the nearest office of the Department of Lands and Forests. In return, the office will send all the information regarding the fish caught.

reels were set up on a frame so that the belts could be threaded or pulled into their permanent position.

The operation of connecting the sections of belt into a continuous circuit requires series of pulleys, clamps and controlled temperature conditions. The area of a splice requires power, protection from the weather and heating so that the vulcanizing of the splice would be successful. The crosssection of the ends of the belt to be joined were cut into interlocking steps similar to a stair case. Care had to be taken to ensure the depth of the cut did not split the fibre of the rubber-bound thread which gives the conveyor its strength. The result was a cut with four or five levels or plys which are then buffed to make the surface rough. The rubber cement was brushed on and partially dried to create a tacky surface before the sections are fitted together. The joint or splice is then covered with nylon tape, a rubber patch and then vulcanized at 200 degrees F and 150 lbs/sq. inch to ensure that the two ends go together and stay together.

The task of delivering coal from coal fields to furnace burners is not a simple one. Self-unloading cargo carriers will unload cargo into the dockside hopper; conveyors take over to carry the coal to the storage area for stocking out by the Stacker-Reclaimer.

In the Fall, it should be ready for reclaiming operations (taking coal from storage into the powerhouse.)

Stacker-Reclaimers are not marketed by Canadian firms; there are only two or three stackers in Canada. These machines are used extensively, in Europe and at least one mine in Alberta, for open-pit mining.

Babcock-Moxey of Great Britain designed and will supervise the assembly of the Stacker-Reclaimer by sub-contractor Lackie Bros. Limited of Kitchener. Structural parts for the Stacker-Reclaimer have been fabricated in Great Britain; the conveyor belts are on the way from Japan; the electrical systems will be provided by Canadian General Electric.

The Stacker-Reclaimer is standing in the coal storage area. The portal frame, table (for turning mechanism) and legs are standing on the 26-foot gauge track bed along the west side of the storage area.

A second Stacker-Reclaimer will be built for the "other" four units of Nanticoke GS. Meanwhile, Hydro's first "monster" is busy feeding four hungry furnaces at Lambton GS near Courtright.

The Stacker-Reclaimer, at Nanticoke, is 84 feet in height, 238 feet in length (without boom), weighs 780 tons, and has nine buckets, equally spaced around the wheel. Bucket capacity is 2.35 cubic yards.
