reported at 2 p.m. that two did come into the Jarvis Hotel.

"I think the teenage people who want to go into a hotel will be small in numbers here.

"In many states of the United States the legal drinking age is 18 and they don't seem to have many problems there.

"This probably will eliminate teenagers sneaking down a back road to drink a full case of beer or a bottle because they couldn't do it anywhere else.

"Many of them will take it in their stride and won't abuse it," he said.

Mr. Lloyd of the American said: "It will also take the pressure off the hotel keepers who had to be more than careful that they didn't serve anyone under 21.

"However, we will still have to make checks if we suspect that any customer may be under the age of 18," he said.
