and on one occasion it was 4 a.m. in the morning.

The cottagers had refused to accept the assertion of Hydro personnel that there had been no oil spill at the station, some of them claiming that their investigation showed that the so-called oil was coming from the plant.

Oil spills, intentional or otherwise must be reported to the Ontario Water Resources Commission and a constant check is carried out to make sure that spills don't occur at the plant.

The so-called oil slick appeared in concentrated form on Tuesday night but smaller concentrations had appeared in various sections of the lake previous to this. It is believed that strong winds contributed to the concentration along the lakeshore.
