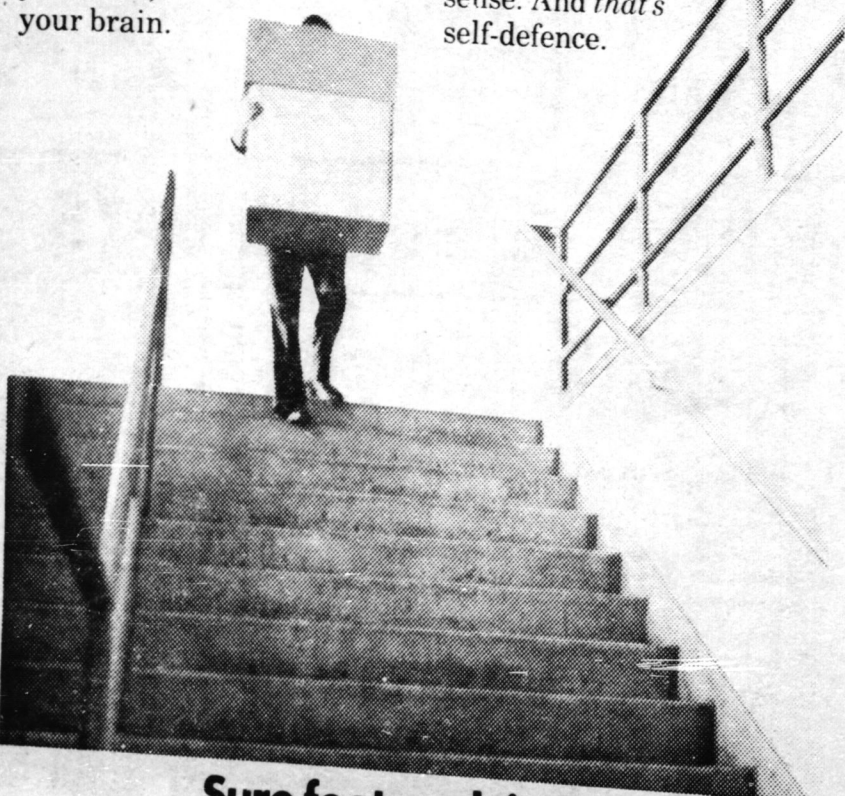

A Successful Year

Mrs. Anne Wolf, executive secretary of the Eye Bank of Canada (Ontario Division), recently presented her annual report for the year ending Dec. 31, 1970.

She reported that a total of 668 eyes have been received during the year. This is an increase of 130 eyes over 1969.

In 1955, when the Eye Bank of Canada was formed by the CNIB and the University of Toronto, two

eyes were donated. To date a total of 4,779 eyes have been received. Mrs. Wolf is anxiously waiting the 5000th eye.

Mrs. Wolf stated that, even with the increased amount of eyes being received, she cannot keep ahead of the demand for eyes. Ever since the eye bank has been formed, there has been a waiting list of people who are waiting their turn to have a corneal transplant.

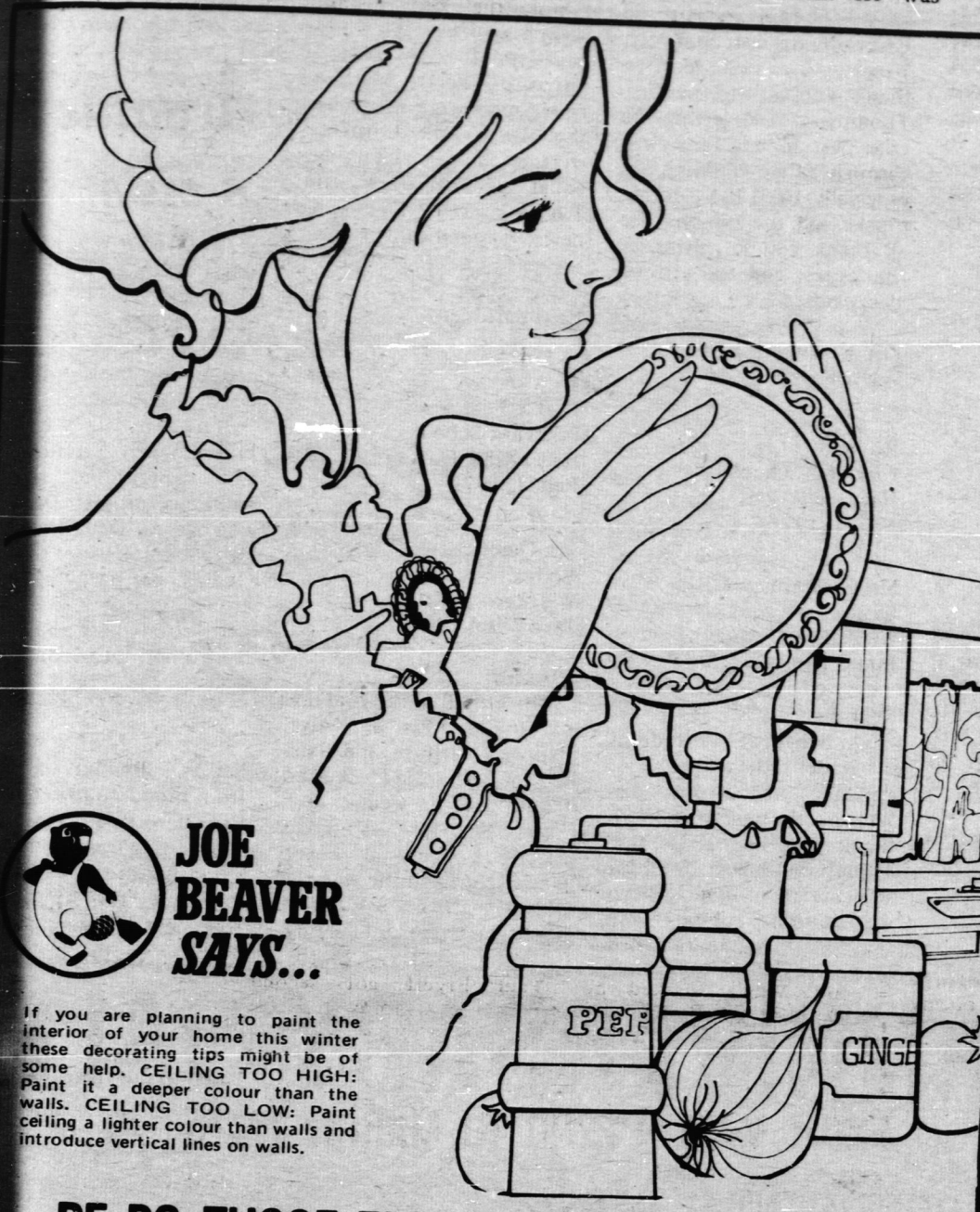
