INCREASE \$373,362

\$6,957,442 is an increase of education. \$373,362 over 1970's budget of \$6,584,000. Due to an accounting procedure introduced in 1970, which involves an accrual of salaries, a more accurate comparison would be \$6,957,442 in 1971 with an increase of \$618,971 over 1970 expenditures of \$6,338,471.

The budget allows for an expenditure of \$626.26 per public school pupil and \$1,242.83 per secondary school pupil. The board estimates its enrolment to be 5255 and 2950 in public and secondary schools respectively.

Provincial assistance in the form of grants and subsidy account for 62.7 percent of the revenue, municipal levy is expected to raise 32.1 percent tuition fees from non-resident. students 4.5 percent and miscellaneous income .7 percent.

Budget procedures differed slightly from previous years. In the early discussions it became evident that the guidelines would be somewhat decline. > In the elementary school budget, the committee has been able to incorporate several improvements. An opportunity class, a class for perceptually handicapped pupils, as well as another speech teacher are included in the budget. As the board is of the opinion that the area of special education has shown success in the previous years, the additional emphasis appears warranted.

The elementary library budget has received an increase. With more library facilities in our schools, the extra "shot in, the arm" will provide

reading and reference material much needed in today's educational program with a place to store.

last two years under the Haldimand-Norfolk study

In a joint meeting Tuesday between the councils of the two counties a resolution was passed that stated the Haldimand-Norfolk study committee be re-established with equal membership and an executive to set up the necessary committees to study functions of the counties on an individual basis as well as hold joint meetings on matters of mutual concern.

The study committee was originally ordered set up to assist the Ontario government and had mostly appointed members to get local views and recommendations on the requirements of the area over a projected period of expansion. The new committees will be mostly elected reeves and deputy reeves of the two councils. The most important aspect of the study group is the question of whether the area will need a regional government and if so how it would operate as well as be

financed. Reeve Ted Powell of Cayuga, who put the resolution said the finances would be one area that the
