Nanticoke environment committee, which will have a total cost of \$800,000.

The partners in the committee are Ontario Hydro, the Steel Company of Canada, and Texaco of Canada Limited.

The results of the survey will serve for comparison when the proposed plants are in operation to determine if there is any significant change in the environment.

The announcement of the partnership survey was made by Ontario Hydro

The fisheries survey will be carried out by the Ontario Department of Lands and Forests and involves checking sport and commercial fish species, including spawning and food cycles over the next three years.

It is to be integrated with the general fish survey Lands and Forests has been doing for the whole of Lake

The work will assist in establishing the existing lake biological base conditions in the part of Long Point Bay which might be affected by Hydro's Nanticoke generating station and the planned facilities of Stelco and Texaco.
