The executive meets the first Wednesday of each month except July and August.

The Units meet bi-monthly except July and August.

The WHGH Auxiliary is associated with the Hospital Auxiliaries Association of Ontario and belongs to District Four which is Niagara Area Hospital Auxiliaries.

Membership fees are one dollar per year for active members and two dollars for associate members.
