For persons wishing to seal their cards, the rates are as follows: To destinations in Canada, seven cents (first class rate); automatically travels by air; to the United States, either seven cents (surface) or 10 cents (air mail); to overseas points, 15 cents (automatically travels by air under the new international all-up service).

All rates are for cards weighing up to one or two ounces, depending on the category. (Check with your local Postmaster).

In 1970, Canadians mailed approximately 155,000,000 Christmas cards. The Post Office staff of 48,000 more than

must have a light at the top.

In the past the light has been shot out on occasions and this past Halloween, someone climbed the tower and removed the red globe and the lights.

Council has a spare globe, but the special lights have been on order for some time. However, Coun. John Brintnell said he thought he could obtain the special lights locally in order to speed up the repairs.

In other business, council decided it would appeal the assessment made on a house in the village it feels was valued at half the acceptable rate.

The regional assessment office in Brantford, according to council, missed assessing the particular house, resulting in homes on each side of the one in question being assessed at a higher rate.

Council informed the assessment office of the error and received a notice Nov. 1 saying that council can appeal the assessment if it is instituted before Oct. 31. Council decided, however, it would still send a registered letter from the village noting the appeal is being sought. As Clerk Lysch said, "this assessment business has gotten to be really something."
