THUNDER BAY, Ont. (CP) - The Canada Manpower Centre here announced that Thunder Bay's employment level at the end of September had reached a point of equalling the best years of the 1960s. A Centre spokesman said most major industries are operating at or near capacity and the level of employment throughout the fall should remain good.

A recently introduced green-shell bean variety, Limelight, is pointing the way to greater field bean production in western Canada. Scientists at the Canada Agriculture

Lethbridge, Alta., Research Station say that Limelight is unusual in that it is tolerant to low temperatures. This characteristic can be bred into other varieties and should help overcome the menace of cool springtime weather which has been at least in part responsible for low yields in western Canada.

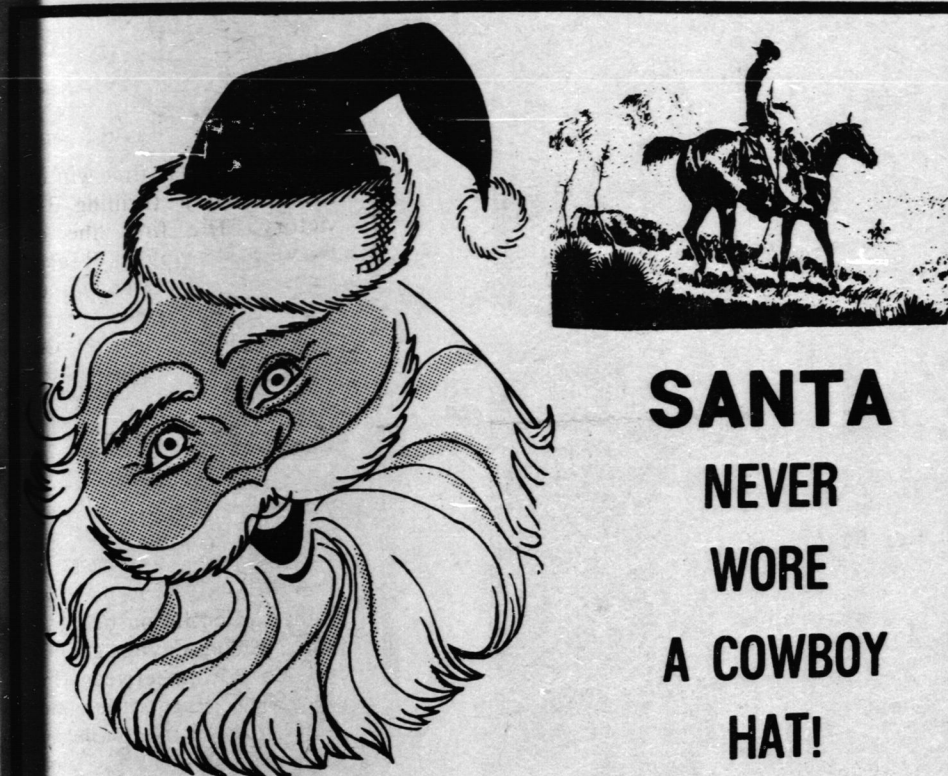
