ARDA Aids Cement Firm To Locate On Manitoulin

Manitoulin - Members of the Whitefish River Indian Band on Manitoulin Island will benefit from the establishment of a new industry on Birch Island, midway between Little Current and Espanola. Under the terms of the Federal-Provincial Rural Development Agreement between the governments of Ontario and Canada, the ARDA administration will assist Canada Cement Lafarge Ltd. to establish cement storage and shipping facilities on Birch Island to serve the northern Ontario market.

Under terms of the agreement announced jointly by William A. Stewart, Ontario's minister of agriculture and food, and Jean Marchand, Canada's minister of regional economic expansion, ARDA will assist Canada Cement Lafarge in establishing these facilities in order to provide additional employment opportunities for local people, particularly those in the Whitefish River Indian Band.

The Band will benefit from the long-term rental arrangements it has negotiated with the cement company. It provides substantial temporary employment during the 12-month construction period which has now begun, and will create a number of permanent jobs once the shipping and storage center is in operation in 1972. This \$2½ million dockside facility will be accessible by both road and rail and will expedite the distribution of cement products to all of northern Ontario. As the market develops, the company hopes to build a cement production plant on the same site within 10 years, with additional employment benefits resulting. The company now owns a large limestone deposit ideally suited for this purpose in the nearby Clohe area.

Under terms of the Rural Development Agreement the ARDA grant in this project is shared equally by the two levels of government and is subject

to the provision that company receives approval for all stages of development from Ontario Water Resources Commission and the Management Branch of Department of Environment.
