If the company issuing the credit card hasn't told you about that new law, and provided you with a postage paid, pre-addressed form for you to use to inform them of your loss, you're off the hook.

Although there are some other provisions of the law, this is the one which applies to most U.S. credit card holders because very few of the issuing companies have

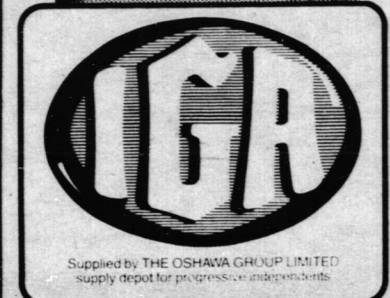
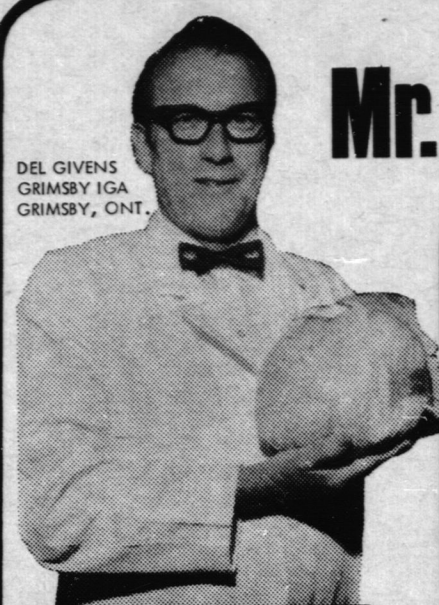
bothered to notify their customers.

Some of the firms feel that if you aren't aware of this provision, you'll be much more prompt in notifying them and they are not planning to comply with this provision at all. Others are just now beginning to make their plans to notify customers.

The same law says that unsolicited cards that have

never been signed or used are exempt from liability of the card customer. Cards that don't provide some means of identification are exempt from liability.

So, rest easier tonight knowing that if your credit card should be lost or stolen, at least you probably won't have to pay for the fraudulent charges that might be made.
