#### Select Committee Of The Legislature On The Ontario Municipal Board Invitation To Submit Written Briefs

On June 30th, 1972, the Ontario Legislature appointed a Select Committee to examine, inquire into and report upon the Ontario Municipal Board and to make recommendations on: (a) the purpose, object and functions of the Ontario Municipal Board. (b) the jurisdiction of the Ontario Municipal Board. (c) the structure and organization of the Ontario Municipal Board. (d) the procedures and practices of the Ontario Municipal Board. (e) the procedures by way of appeal from the orders and rulings of the Ontario Municipal Board, including appeals by way of petitions to the Lieutenant Governor in Council. (f) the relationship of the Ontario Municipal Board in the discharge of its responsibilities with the Provincial Government, local government and the individual citizen.

The Committee invites written briefs from individuals and organizations who may wish to present information, opinions or suggestions regarding any of the above matters relating to the Ontario Municipal Board.

### Tillsonburg To Celebrate Centennial

TILLSONBURG - One hundred years old as a town, Tillsonburg is planning to kick up its heels on Homecoming Weekend Aug. 11 to 13.

Centennial celebrations have been going on all year as the community joins in marking the anniversary of the incorporation of the town in 1872, but all signs point to Homecoming as being the major event.

Old boys and girls from many parts of North America are planning to come back for special reunion events.

Businessmen are joining in the celebrations, with downtown Broadway being closed to traffic, and merchants moving out on the street with old-fashioned sales. Many organizations will be operating food and souvenir booths, and there will be bands and carnival rides.

The Rotary Club will be operating a buffalo barbecue and beer garden on Friday and Saturday.

den on Friday and Saturday. Kinettes will have children's games, and centennial souvenir candles.

Registration for homecomers will be handled by the Senior Citizens Club at the town hall, and they'll have centennial hats for sale.

Optimist Club is sponsoring a big youth dance at the tobacco auction exchange Friday night, featuring two top groups, Doctor Music and Leigh Ashford.

Saturday night, the Lions Club is bringing in the Tex Beneke band, with the Glenn Miller sound, for a dance at the auction exchange. Paula Kelly and the Modernaires will appear with Beneke. The Lions will also hold the draw for a Cadillac that night.

Saturday morning school reunions will be held at Robt St., Tillson Ave. and St. Mary's schools, and in the afternoon at Glendale and Annandale High Schools.

Sunday at 2.45 p.m. an open-air service will be held at Coronation Park, with a number of former local ministers taking part.

Most of the funds raised by service groups will be going towards the town's birthday present to itself - a million dollar plus community centre complex, with Olympic size indoor pool.

Jim Jones is chairman of the town's centennial committee, with Roy Beechey and John Mather as vice-chairman.

Special centennial medallions have been minted, and the Rotarians are offering wooden nickels. A number of other souvenir centennial items have been prepared, including bumper stickers, centennial cook books, a Hospital Auxiliary project, ornamental candles and beer mugs.
