## **Christmas Seal Dollars For** Research

The balance in medicine between service and research continues to weigh heavily in favour of health care del-

ivery. Dr. David V. Bates, Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, University of British Columbia and President-elect of the Canadian Thoracic Society estimates that 1.36 million dollars is spent yearly in Canada on research into lung disease while the yearly cost of hospital admissions alone for those with respiratory illnesses is at least 100 million dollars a year.

The 100 million dollar figure is based on 1968 hospital admissions for adults between the ages of 15 and 75 years of age, on the number of patient days, allowing a per diem rate of \$50. per day and an economic loss of \$20. per day.

About a quarter of Canada's research funds for respiratory disease comes from Respiratory Disease Associations . . . the Christmas Seal Organization.

The Norfolk - Haldimand TB and RD Association earmarks Christmas Seal dollars to the Provincial and Canadian Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Associations for research and scholarship grants to carry out intensive research programs, clinical work, and teaching and education in the Tuberculosis and Respiratory Dis-

ease field. Research projects currently involve tuberculin skin testing, and many areas concerned with breathing problems including asthma, the mechanics of breathing, the effects of air pollution, clearance mechanisms in the lung, respiratory failure, respiratory function and exercise capacity, and hypersensity

lung disease. The research is vital to those suffering from the lung cripplers, emphysema, chronic bronchitis, asthma (and of course, tuberculosis).

The Canadian Thoracic Society, the medical arm of the Canadian Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Association, chooses the research projects and names the scholarship grant recipients across Canada, provincial associations with similar medical bodies carry out the same function in their prov-
