Putting Up

Christmas Tree

One of the biggest thrills at Christmas is decorating the tree. It should brighten your home for three or four weeks, says D.B. McNeill, horticultural specialist, Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food.

The type of tree you select will determine the length of time you can expect it to look good. Pine trees last longer than spruce or balsam and can beset up earlier.

Use a stand that holds water and refill it daily. This will keep the tree moist, help to retain the needles, and reduce the risk of fire. Evergreen needles are extremely flammable, so take extra care with strings of lights. They should be checked for frayed wires and shorts before installing.

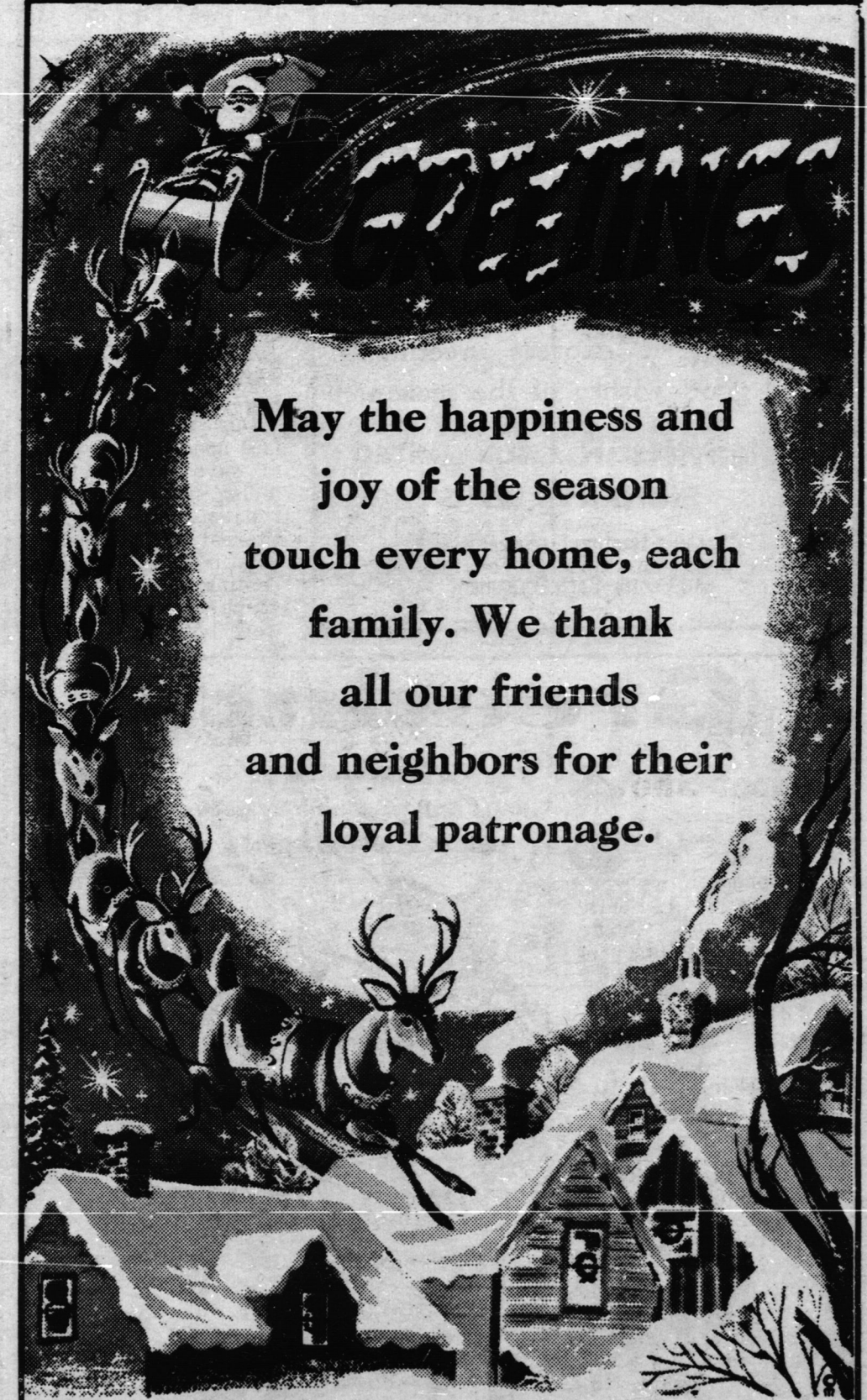
