ently undergoing some reorganization and there has been the feeling expressed that there has been a lack of co-ordination, guidance and goals during the second phase of its work.

An interim report, expected to have been released by the end of January, is expected to outline three possible types of government of the area. The release of the report is expected shortly, at least before Feb. 14.

Mr. Bales has stressed the report is not government policy, but has urged the committee members to pay close attention to it and to be prepared to suggest constructive alternatives if they disagree with it.

The local government phase of the report is continuing and no specific details are expected to be contained in the interim report.

A report on the first phase of the study, land use and planning, has been completed but has not yet been released by the government.

This report is still before the provincial cabinet and contains, among its many other recommendations, the possible site for a satellite city, the construction of which hinges on the expected industrial boom following the start of construction by the Steel Company of Canada Ltd. on its 6,600 acre tract at Nanticoke, construction of this steel making complex, it is most generally believed will be ready to get underway sometime in 1973.

THUNDER PUMP

The bitters, legendary bird of the marsh is found throughout the old and new world. Called thunder-pump or stake-driver from the peculiar vocal sounds it makes during the breeding season. These have both the rhythm and sound of a suction pump, working slowly in thick muddy water. The sound carries far and is surprisingly loud close at hand. Bitterns skulk about the edge of marshes, often "freezing" with bill pointed vertically, eyes gleaming beneath and plumage blending into the reeds.

Fritters from Holland



These warm, crispy fritters will be well received as an appetizer at your next gathering. Quick and easy to prepare, Holland cheese fritters fit the bill before a formal dinner, before buffet suppers or during informal get-togethers. Serve with your favorite cocktail or aperitif wine.

Take:
2 cups shredded imported Holland Edam or Gouda
3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
1 tablespoon minced onion
1 teaspoon baking powder
2 eggs, beaten
cooking oil for deep-fat frying
Mix together shredded Holland cheese, flour, baking powder and onion. Add beaten egg and stir until cheese is evenly distributed in the batter. In a deep skillet or saucepan, heat cooking oil, about 2 inches deep, to 375°F. Carefully drop teaspoonsful of batter into oil. Cook 2-3 minutes until fritter is golden brown, turning once during the cooking period.

Drain on absorbent paper. Serve hot. Makes 3 dozen cocktail fritters.

Fritters can be prepared in advance and kept in the freezer up to three months. To reheat and serve, place frozen fritters on baking sheet in 350°F oven for 5-7 minutes.

Tasty Variations:
• Salmon - Add 1 (3½ oz.) can salmon, drained and flaked
• Shrimp - Add ½ cup chopped cooked shrimp
• Apple - Omit onions. Add ½ cup chopped apple
• ½ teaspoon cinnamon
