## Federation News

A resolution was passed at the O.F.A. director's meeting in Toronto on Jan. 19 concerning the marketing of corn. It reads as follows: Whereas commercial corn growers in Dundas County have found that \$1.05 per bushel will not maintain a viable corn industry in Dundas County and, Whereas commercial corn growers in other counties in Ontario are

experiencing similar difficulties, and Whereas the production of commercial corn in the Province of Ontario has been proven a valuable contribution to our agricultural economy, and

Whereas there does not exist at present, an organized system of marketing corn at a profitable level, and Whereas the O.F.A. is a province-wide organization and is the logical vehicle

for setting in motion concerted effort, Therefore be it resolved that the O.F.A. seek the support of commercial corn growers in other counties in Ontario to establish a corn marketing plan.

The time has come for corn growers to realize that until now no one is responsible for the marketing of corn. If the supply is heavy at harvest time the grower is at the buyer's mercy. Organized growers should be able to do better bargaining than individuals.
