suitable "lower tier" units in a "two-tier" system would be eliminated by outright consolidation into a "one-tier" regional municipality, the report states.

However, the basic differences in character of the region would still exist and problems in inequitable representation would be hard to avoid.

The report states this could lead to friction and ineffectiveness in a one-tier government, or eventually to the neglect of rural interests by an urban-dominated council, or both.

Some of the problems inherent in a "one-tier" system could be eliminated by the introduction of a "community board" concept, the report states.

This is a recent development in municipal government theory. It has a degree of flexibility in municipal administration by enabling individual communities to obtain extra services if they are prepared to pay for them.

It gives representatives of such communities the opportunity to review, but not veto, municipal actions which concern their localities directly.

It provides a channel of communications between the individual citizen and what may appear to be a remote and inaccessible municipal council.

It broadens the opportunity for the citizen to participate in public affairs.

The third alternative is that of dividing the area into a small number of separate municipalities.

This approach, the report states, is a departure from the policy of creating "two-tier" regional municipalities, which has been the practice followed so far by the provincial government.

Niether, however, is such a reorganization excluded by the province's policy statement on government made in 1968. It has been, in effect, the system adopted in the case of Thunder Bay.

Mr. Richardson said it is at "least reasonable to consider as an alternative a series of unitary municipalities where responsibilities are clear to their citizens and which can be grouped into administrative or special purposes in respect to which they can work as effective partners of the provincial government.

"Of course, it must also be recognized that the possibility of a single municipality being included in different regional groupings for different purposes presents its own problems."

A third area to be considered, the report states, is that of the rapid

government the people would like changed.

In Haldimand a pattern of separate market areas, which are not closely tied to each other, was found.

The major economic and government activities are in different towns. Dunnville's market area extends west through thinly populated areas almost to Cayuga.

The limited extent of Cayuga's market area suggests its limited influence on the county's economic and social structure.

Jarvis takes in a broad area extending in all directions from the village, and is the only municipality in Haldimand which has a market area extending significantly over the county line.

The pattern in Norfolk is quite different, the study found. Norfolk is seen as a hierarchy with one major economic and government centre, Simcoe. Surrounding it is a number of smaller, vigorous centres and closely linked to it by economic, social and government ties.

Haldimand and Norfolk are not strongly linked together, the

report states and except for Jarvis, the market areas of most towns are contained within their own counties and do not cross county lines.

The report found the people in both counties identify strongly with their own municipalities, more so than with their counties.

People, both urban and rural, expressed great concern for the protection and preservation of their natural surroundings and recreation areas. Townspeople want to preserve the friendly small-town atmosphere.

It was found that urbanization, industrialization and pollution pose the major threats to the natural environment and to the quality of life people enjoy in the towns and in the rural areas.

It was also found that people believe local government is closest to the people, the most responsive to local needs and of great importance to the well being of their communities.

There is a dissatisfaction shown with the county school boards as being not responsive to local needs with costs and red tape having been

increased beyond reason.

The provincial government is regarded not as a creation and servant of the citizens, but as an independent power which increases its authority at the expense of the citizens.

Regional government is not regarded as a means of restoring power to the local areas. Rather it is considered to be another way to deprive local governments of the few powers left to them, and to reduce even further the importance of the individual citizen.

Paradoxically, both opponents and supporters of regional government are in agreement.

Both see the same problems ahead, both have the same fears about the dangers of units of government and both support increased power at the local level.

But those who support regional government tend to believe it is the best compromise between the limitations of local government and the disadvantages of having the province take over.

Only a few neither county favored joining their county with any other county. But, if some type of union were required, the majority in both Haldimand and Norfolk would rather join with each other than with any of the other adjacent counties.
