fixed at 75 per cent of the value of land and buildings.

At the first council meeting in December, council learned that the firm would likely move its business from Hagersville under the new assessment.

Clerk A. A. Roth reported to council that its solicitor had requested certain information in preparation for a police arbitration hearing scheduled for Jan. 24. The solicitor requested to know the demands of the police and the offer made by council. The intention of the hearings is to dispute only those items that council is not in agreement with.

Coun. Norm Crawford and Coun. Basil asked that the clerk request George McMullin, engineer, to attend council's next meeting on Jan. 10 and that

"Somewhere along about this time there will arise a need for a new town."

"Why is there a need for a new town at all? Primarily it is a way of avoiding overexpense and undue human agony. Each community as it stands is a balance of industry, commerce and residences.

"Jarvis, for instance, is geared to a population of 1,000 to 2,000. If Jarvis was to be expanded to 10,000 the downtown core would have to expand by 10 times to service 10 times the population. This would have to be done at the expense of relocating those living immediately around the downtown core. This is tremendously costly and always results in a great deal of turmoil. The 'human agony' occurs when people near the community core have to be relocated and they really don't want this.

"So, a compromise is needed. This can be done by enlarging each municipality to as big as each can go, then create a new town. It is no more expensive to do this and in the long term may be less expensive."
