said it would appear that it would be three months before the contract is let and could be June 1 before "things get underway."

Reeve Kincaid noted he had received a couple of calls from local contractors asking about the project. "This appears to be a very competitive time and it would be to our advantage to get this as soon as possible."

Reeve Kincaid also asked Mr. McMullin if he could contact the road engineer at the county building in Cayuga regarding timing of the reconstruction of King St. Mr. McMullin said the project will take a full construction season. "It's a \$300,000 job and we can't expect a contractor on that type of work to do \$100,000 a month."

Mr. McMullin had been asked to make a visual survey of construction work being carried on at a townhouse development in the north end of the village and at a subdivision development off Parkview Rd.

He reported he had not as yet received the subdivision's grading plans, but expects them soon. The grading plans set the standard of fall on the level of each lot as it pertains to the drainage of the lots.

There have been six lots developed in the subdivision to date. Mr. McMullin agreed to have the site inspected periodically during the construction and report to council.

On the townhouse development, Mr. McMullin said the development of a site plan should have been received in order for council to be assured that the developers would carry out the plan and provide a second access to the townhouses.

Mr. McMullin said the Ontario Water Resources Commission proposal for the takeover of the village's

sewage treatment plant should be ready by early February.

Reeve Kincaid noted that council's request for a water pipeline from Lake Erie had received the support of the entire county. "I realize its going to be slow coming, but the OWRC didn't expand that intake (at Nanticoke) just for the sake of it."

Mr. McMullin said in the overall situation, it was a small amount of money for the OWRC to spend to enlarge the intake, but "I don't think there are any plans progressing on it now."

"However, if there is an upturn in business this year, there is a good chance Stelco may move fairly soon. That would help the development of the scheme (for a pipeline)."

There were nine permits issued for renovations and repairs which amounted to \$8,070.

By far the greatest number of permits were issued for residential construction.

Eight permits were issued for new single family dwellings at a total of \$130,900. There was one permit issued for town housing at a value of \$450,000 with three permits issued for multiple family housing valued at \$199,000. One permit issued for work on multiple family dwelling valued at \$280,000, but work was not begun on the project last year.

There were four permits for additions to older residential housing at a total value of \$4,000. However, there were 57 permits issued at a value of \$60,765 for renovations and repairs to existing dwellings.

a witch hunt. This is not the intent. This can be handled directly and we would not be beating anybody with a stick."

Clerk Wilson said council is in a position where it must safeguard everyone.

"If there is something that can be stopped and you don't stop it then it could cause considerable problems in the township. We have bylaws to cover many areas and we must apply them."

Coun. W. E. Evans said that "some places can't get insurance because the building next door is in a run down condition. On a farm where buildings are far apart, its okay, but in built up areas it's not very good if a man can't get insurance because of an unsafe building next door."

"The courts won't absolve you if a person is hurt on your land in a fallen down building. The onus is still on the owner."

Clerk Wilson noted this "is protection for you and everyone else."

Coun. Nie contended that "freedom of the individual hardly exists anymore," and the matter was laid over for another meeting.

Council received a letter from the Department of Municipal Affairs expressing concern over urban type of development within the township.

The DMA noted that 10 lots in the township unrelated to farming had been sold in the past year and suggested that no more be sold until new guidelines in the township's official plan had been approved.

The letter did say that the township could create severances related to farming only during the interim until the official plan can be refined to take this into consideration.

Clerk Wilson said the township would still be free to give severances to legitimate farm operations. Deputy-reeve Meehan said when "we passed the official plan we must have gotten off the track" in this type of situation.

Reeve Miller said that if a person wishes to build near a hamlet that would still be allowed.
