Federation News

We will probably have an increase in the cost of talking over the telephone. Bell of Canada has made application to the Canadian Transport Commission for permission to increase rates. This is the commission that sets the rules and Bell must justify to them the need for an increase. Negotiations can be lengthy.

O.F.A. requested Bell to explain their case as many directors objected to increased rates. At the December board meeting the regional supervisor of Bell Canada explained their position. Bell is not affiliated with any American Company as it was at one time. It is one of their major goals to keep the company completely Canadian.

From 1958 to 1970 rates increased on 3 1/2 percent basic telephone service. Good service must change with the times and increased use. It is expensive to install a new telephone and at present there are 2,000 people awaiting this service, explained Bell's representative.

The increase applied for would consist of 50 cents per month for one phone and 10 cents per month for extension phones. If they are not successful in attaining this increase, telephone services will deteriorate considerably. A number of American telephone companies have collapsed due to lack of money.

Bell Canada's explanation of a need for an increase in rates seems reasonable and O.F.A. will not oppose it.

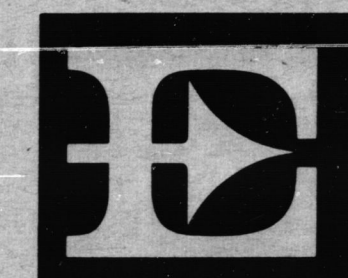
