GRCA

Receives Grant

Leo Bernier, Minister of Natural Resources and James N. Allan, M.P. for Haldimand - Norfolk announce the approval of a provincial grant of \$19,000 to the Grand River Conservation Authority for Byng Island Conservation Area.

This Conservation Area comprises some 187 acres of land on the lower Grand River in the Town of Dunnville.

The Authority proposes to carry out development work which will include installation of additional hydro, water and sanitary facilities, construction of additional roads and parking lots, tree planting, general ground improvements, provision of additional picnic and sanitary facilities and other general development work.

In addition, approval of a further grant of \$3,000 has been announced by the province for the Grand River Conservation Authority for the Caledonia Conservation area.

The authority is proposing to carry out a development program in the area which will entail ground improvement work including grading and clearing; general development such as a fencing; provision of picnic and sanitary facilities and signs; demolition of old mill foundations and extension of storm sewer; replacement of two gates on the millrace and construction of a footbridge.

interpret what they like from what is written, the article did not question the integrity of the SCUA nor that the tournament that was run on June 9, 10, 11 and 12 was dishonest.

The umpires have agreed that if the above explanation is not sufficient, then they will umpire all games with the exception of the Hagersville Intermediate home games.

Following the publication June 15 of Myke's report on the SCUA sponsored tournament, the umpires decided they would not umpire any games until an apology had been printed.

The SCBA in turn decided an apology was not necessary and in turn, last week suspended the umpires.

On Sunday a meeting was held at the

home of secretary Bill Godlowski and only one of the 24 umpires in attendance voted against cancellation of the boycott.

Chandler, who handed down the suspension last week, expressed appreciation for the results of the meeting and placed the onus on Myke to explain that his writeups in no way questioned the integrity of the SCUA.

As further background, the controversy began after the account of the tournament in which Burlington was named winner, after being unbeaten while Jarvis received second-place money with one defeat in the double-knockout tournament.
