Little We Can Do About Cyclists, Says Jarvis Council

An upset Jarvis council Tuesday night decided there was little it could do as a body to prevent a recurrence of the village being victimized by a group of motorcyclists

such as occurred this past Saturday night and Sunday morning. Reeve Dr. William Austin, reporting to council on a meeting held with several Jarvis merchants and the

Cayuga Ontario Provincial Police sergeant this week said "there is not much the village can do about it." Last weekend a group of about 15 motorcyclists created several hours of havoc on the main street resulting in mischief charges and a charge under the Liquor Control Act being laid.

Council To Meet Monday On Recreation

HAGERSVILLE - Chairmen of the various recreation boards of the village will be meeting Monday, July 17 with Hagersville council to discuss the consolidation of the boards into a single Hagersville recreation committee.

The meeting is being called for 7.30 p.m. Council initiated the move last month when it was decided insufficient use was being made of some recreational facilities in the village, such as the arena during the summer.

Hagersville School Band On European Concert Tour

HAGERSVILLE - A 24-day tour of Europe is now underway for the 51 members of the Hagersville Secondary School Concert Band, the culmination of two years of saving and planning.

The departure on Friday from the school was both a scene of excitement and pride, especially for band director George Shippey who formed the school's first band in 1968.

Mr. Shippey said the band "has received fantastic support in all its fund-raising activities. I just want to express my thanks to everyone who had a hand in the success of this tour."

The group, which also includes eight adult chaperones and a nurse, were taken to Toronto International Airport by Henderson Motors, of Jarvis and will be picked up at the end

of the month by Heaslip Motors, of Hagersville, both trips free of charge.

The instruments for the tour were packed by Livingston Industries Ltd. Some of the smaller instruments are being carried by individual band members.

The band was scheduled to arrive in London Saturday morning.

Tractor Pull Makes Haldimand Appearance

CAYUGA - Those roaring, exhaust-belching monsters of the tractor world will be making their second noisy appearance this weekend in Haldimand County.

The tractor pulling competition, which made its controversial debut in Canada last year at the International Plowing Match at Harewood Acres returns Saturday night and Sunday at Cayuga International Speedway near Nelles Corners.

The event pits the high powered machines against one another in a weight dragging contest.

The Canadian championship plus \$6,000 in
