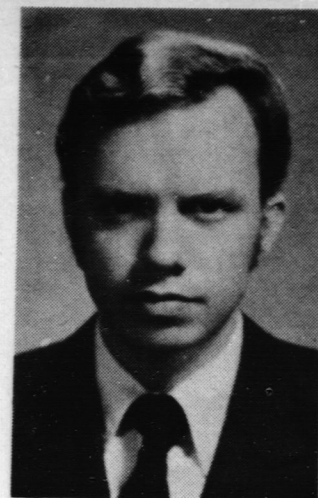


## Area Grads

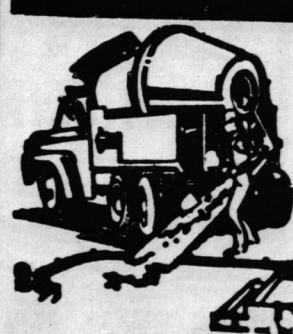

In the first meeting of the year between Waterford and Jarvis, Waterford came out on top by a score of 2-1 in 10 innings. Former Jarvis ace Johnny Edwards got credit for the win by pitching four innings of one hit shutout ball. Bobby Smith was the only one to hit Edwards safely.

Edwards walked one and struck out two in his relief stint. De-Freyne went the first six innings allowing five hits, walking two and striking out one.

Waterford committed four errors while Jarvis made only two. Wray Carpenter went the full 10 innings allowing eight hits, walking three and striking out six.

Barry Miller led the Jarvis hitters with two singles while Gird

Before the largest crowd of the season, Hagersville Intermediates put on a comedy of errors in losing to Langton by a score of 16-2. The story of the game shows in the line score as Hagersville made two runs from five hits while committing 16 errors.

Langton picked up 16 runs on only eight hits but made only two errors. Jim Herkimer pitched brilliant ball and deserved a better fate.

Langton sent 14 men to bat in the third inning and scored 10 runs. The infield made six errors in this inning as they couldn't find the handle on the ball or failed to cover a base when they did pick it up.

Bill Prince and Butch DeMille were the only two bright spots in an otherwise dismal showing. Prince picked up two hits with Larry Simon, Butch DeMille and Herkimer getting a hit apiece. Simon worked the last three innings and gave up five runs. Leighfield carried the big stick for Langton banging

out three hits. Sunday afternoon in Simcoe the boys looked a little better, scoring eight times off Spud Chandler. This has to be a career high for runs off the stylish left hander.

One of Herkimer's was a two run homer while Teddy Phibbs cracked a grand slammer in the eighth. The boys still came out on the short end of a 14-8 score as they continued to make errors. Simcoe scored seven times in the sixth inning to put the game out of reach.

Teddy Phibbs started on the hill but was relieved by Herkimer and Simons.

They rocked McKeen for a double and a triple for the final run in the eighth. Hagersville threatened in the ninth but left the bases loaded as Daryl Marlin struck out.

Hagersville out hit St. Thomas 10-9. Davey led the attack with three hits. Ross McKeen and Danny Donato had two hits apiece. Single hits went to Robbie Stewart, Stu Williams and Glen Hewson.

On Sunday afternoon, sparked by Ross McKeen's 12 strikeouts, Hagersville crushed Simcoe Juniors by a score of 9-1. McKeen allowed only four hits with two of them coming in the sixth when Simcoe scored their lone run.

Hagersville led 4-1 after six innings but broke the game wide open with five runs in the last of the eighth. Dave Davey continued his hot streak with three more hits. Robbie Stewart and Anthony Yacolino picked up two hits apiece.
