 Your May cheque will not include the increase.
 Your June cheque will include:
 Back payments—January to May \$14.40
 New rate of regular monthly cheque 82.88
 Total to be paid in June only \$97.28

Your old age pension and supplement
 Those who are receiving maximum benefits under the combined Old Age Security and Guaranteed Income Supplement will be entitled to \$150 for a single person or a married person whose husband or wife is not a pensioner and \$285 for a married couple where both are pensioners—\$142.50 each.

Those who are now receiving a **partial supplement** will also receive the same amount of adjustment, but not the new maximum benefits noted above.

Your **May cheque** will not include the increase.
 Your **June cheque** will be at the new rate and will also include the back payments to last January.

 Additional information will be mailed to all pensioners in mid-June. Information is also available from the Regional Old Age Security Office in the capital city of your province.
