

Haldimand Guiders Honored

The Medal of Merit, which is given to members of the Girl Guides of Canada for exceptional service, was presented to Mrs. G. Elliott of Caledonia, by the Area Commissioner, Mrs. R. Booth of Simcoe.

Mrs. Elliott has been Captain of the First Caledonia Guide Company for many years and is also a trainer for the movement. She has served on the Niagara Area Council as program chairman and is serving on the provincial program committee - in this capacity she has helped form the program of Guiding in Canada.

Following the presentation, Mrs. Booth read a congratulatory letter from the Provincial Commissioner, Mrs. H. F. Crosby.

Another leader, well known to the girls and leaders of Haldimand, received the Thanks badge from Haldimand Division for service to the movement beyond what would normally be expected. Pat Petracca, of Hagersville, who received this badge from Mrs. Booth, has been a Guide Captain, District and Division Commissioner and is now a Ranger leader.

She has camped many years at the Niagara Area Camp Kienuka, and served on the National Ranger Sub committee for the new Ranger program.

These awards were presented at the annual Haldimand Division Dinner, held this year at the Presbyterian church hall in Caledonia.

Mrs. William Burley, District Commissioner for Caledonia, welcomed the leaders. Commissioner for Haldimand, Mrs. A. Canon Brooks thanked those who had been
