On Friday, May 26, the Hagersville Secondary School Geography 35 classes took a field trip to various sites in the area for the purpose of observation of various land formations. At an old quarry site students discussed the formation of quarries, land ridges and the swampland at Dry Lake.

Various characteristics of the Grand River were observed; for example, there is a large flood plain on one bank and not the other; the hills and gullies near the river run parallel to it; and there is excellent agricultural soil along the river bank. The reasons for these phenomena were explained.

The Niagara and the Onondaga Escarpments were analyzed; glacial land features such as drumlins and kettle lakes were evident; the scrub land and swamps of the Hamil-
