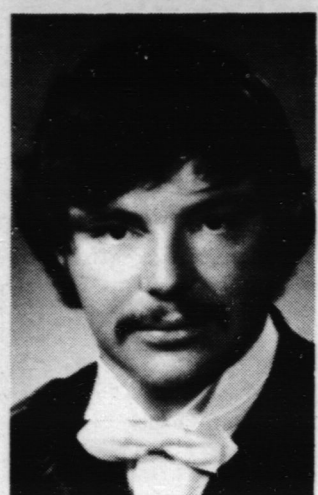

However, under Canada's food and drug act, a lengthy testing process is required before a new product can be licensed here. New Herbicides have been licensed now and com-

petition is setting prices well below what they had been in the past.

Shopping for corn herbicides is still necessary as prices range from \$1.75 per lb. and up, to whatever farmers are willing to pay.
