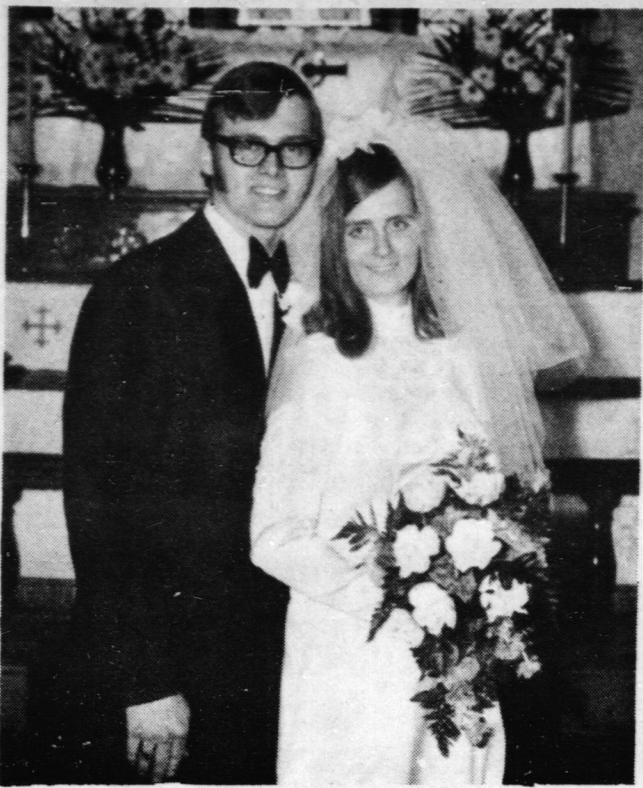


## Martin - Cummings

## HAGERSVILLE Highlights

### Legion Branch 64 Meeting

Presiding over his first meeting as President, Clarence Jackson read two applications for membership, John James Ogden and Mr. Isaac.

The meeting was held Tuesday June 6 with 22 regular members, one honorary and one fraternal present. Due to the absence of Treasurer Reg McGarth, the president read the report, seconded by L. Ince.

A thank-you letter was read from the Cancer Society, for the use of the hall on numerous occasions, and the co-operation of the Legion and Auxiliary in having two parties in April. A. L. Peter Hendricks reported a young man, who had been a member of the Cadet Corps, formerly sponsored by his branch, had passed away. A memorial is being started by Simcoe branch in his name.

It was agreed Hagersville would donate this fund when more information is available from Simcoe. A motion was made to

donate \$50. to the recent Walkathon, sponsored by the local Lions, since no one had approached the Branch this year for sponsorship.

With regard to supplying the Bantam Ball team with new uniforms, a request was read from Nat Salvatore. New uniforms for 15 boys would cost \$187.50 plus tax. A further request for \$100. was made to assist with operation costs of the team, and to pay umpires. It was moved and seconded by P. Hendricks, and F. Brown that this donation be given to the ball team.

Much discussion took place regarding the proposed panning of the auditorium. Motion was made that this contract be let, at the designated price, and to begin on this project immediately.

L. Lang, T. Brooks and J. Krauskopf constitute the building committee.

Ted Brooks reported the new speakers are not set up to best advantage, and should be placed at another angle. Ted Stephens said this would be no problem and will be remedied in the near future, also replacing the mike, before the account is paid.

Much chef's skill was shown by Ben Kiefer, Howard Hewitt, Alvin Hewitt and others.

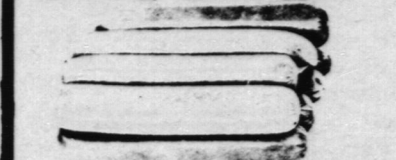
### Explorers Close
