

Hagersville Set For Dominion Day Celebration

HAGERSVILLE - With the lighting of the hard wood logs Friday night that will cook an entire side of beef, the Hagersville and District Lions Club July 1 Celebration will be underway.

Last year was the first time the club had undertaken the cooking of a steer and the club expects a crowd to watch the

placing of the dressed steer on the electrically driven spit. Lion Chef Ed Langley and his fellow cooks will be doing the honors about 7 p.m. in the park. The beef will be ready for eating at 1.30 p.m. on Saturday.

The main events of the weekend get underway Saturday at 1 p.m. with what is shaping

up to be a "very good" parade with a number of bands participating.

The parade will form up at the arena and travel south on Sherring St. to King St. and then up to the main intersection, travelling down to Park St. and then on Alma St. to the park.

During the afternoon there will be rides for the youngsters and a big water show. There will also be refreshment booths set up on the grounds.

The Hagersville Library Guild is also taking a part in the July 1 celebration with its Art in the Park '72 display. Various arts and crafts will

be on display in the park and the articles will be for sale.

There will also be a teen dance during the afternoon with the Max Rats Band, of Brantford, performing.

In the evening the Paul Hanover Show is being staged at the tennis courts in the park.

Tickets are being sold on a car by the Lions Club. All profits from the car and the July 1 celebration will be going towards completing the Hagersville Library, the Girl Guide and Boy Scout meeting hall and the youth drop - in centre at the Davison Centre, at the corner of David and Alma Sts.

Council Moves To Seek Recreational Restructuring

HAGERSVILLE (Staff) Council has decided to investigate the possibility of restructuring its municipally supported recreational system with a view to co-ordinating the various recreation boards under a central organization.

Council members moved to initiate the study at a meeting here Monday with a letter to Douglas Garvie, a senior recreational representative with the provincial department of education. An invitation to the department official was

extended to visit Hagersville for discussions on the suggestion.

Councillor Robert Gedye told The Record following the meeting that possibly Hagersville would look at consolidating the existing recreation boards under a recreational director for the town.

Citing one instance under current conditions, Mr. Gedye said the arena facilities for washrooms and snack bar are not utilized to their maximum benefit for summer activities held in the area. No proposal was presented to council at the meeting and council

Teacher For 27 Years, Mrs. Louella Hedges, Retires

After 27-years teaching in three schools, Mrs. George (Louella) Hedges, of Lambs Corners, retires this week.

Mrs. Hedges, the former Louella Booth, taught for four years at Lambs School, eight years at the Jarvis School and 15 years at the McGaw's School and South Walpole

District School since her family has grown up.

She began her teaching career in 1927 as a supply teacher, after graduating from Normal School, at No. 4 Oneida. After two weeks, she was called to the Lambs School.

In 1938 she married George Hedges and retired from teaching

to raise a family of three sons and a daughter. She was called back and accepted into the teaching profession in 1957 and taught eight years at McGaws School, which became the Wilson Mac Donald Memorial School Mus-

Industrial Arts And Home Economics To Be Provided

The Haldimand County Board of Education received committee reports June 20, with the management committee recommending industrial arts and

home economics be provided for the Grade 8 pupils of J. L. Mitchener and Caledonia Centennial Schools at the Dunnville Senior Public School and Caledonia High Schools

respectively.

The program will be on the same basis as in 1971-1972. It is expected that by the fall of 1973, with the completion of the facilities at Parkview Public School, Hagersville most Grade 7 and 8 pupils in the County will be accommodated in this program.

The committee further reported on the resignations received and positions filled. At the present time all vacancies have been filled. Twenty-three elementary and 18 secondary school teachers.
