

## Full Weekend Of Events At Port Dover

PORT DOVER - This lakeside community will be hosting its largest and most fun filled weekend of the season beginning Friday night. The annual Port Dover July 1 celebration will get underway Friday night with an Amateur Night in Powell Park.

Saturday's events will begin with a special mass at St. Cecilia's Church at 9 a.m. followed by the Kinsmen Club's Soap

Box Derby and the fishing fleet review at 11 a.m. at the pier. The parade begins at 1.30 p.m.

Bill Hurst is planning the second annual country music jamboree Sunday evening July 2 in the Lions Park. This four-hour show will feature dozens of musical groups.

The Kinettes will arrange the children's section of the parade and provide the prizes. Port Dover will again donate \$50 for the best decorated float in the parade.

The Port Dover Lions Club annual band tattoo committee received notice last week that the Crusaders Band of Rochester, N.Y. will be in town July 1.

This band has 110 marchers.

Five other marching bands have signed contracts to participate in the parade and tattoo.

The committee has decided a special Best Clown category would be added to the prize list for the first time this year. Fewer plaques and more cash prizes are to be awarded successful entrants.

In an effort to raise funds for the local Lions Club's project of a \$100,000 medical centre in Port Dover, the July 1 committee is holding a draw with the prize to be two jet airplane tickets to London, England or to the Caribbean. Either
