What To Do In '72, Corn — Forage Theme

The theme What To Do In '72 has been chosen for this year's Corn and Forage Show to be held at the Haldimand Agricultural Centre, Kohler, on March 15 and 16.

Exhibits will be received on Tuesday March 14, from 8 p.m. to 9 p.m., and on Wednesday March 15, from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m.

Russell Smith, Caledonia, is chairman for the Wednesday morning program. Judging of the classes will take place from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. At 10.15 a.m. a farm Machinery Symposium will be held with the following participants: Hal Wright, secretary, Farm Machinery Advisory Board, and

secretary, Farm Safety Council of Ontario, as well as representatives from International Harvester, Allis Chalmers, White Motors, Massey Ferguson and John Deere. A smorgasbord is planned for 12 noon. Wednesday March 15, Chairman Bruce Smith will introduce the program including president's remarks.

Beginning at 1.05 p.m. Professor T.H. Lane will speak on the subject Soil Management for Maximum Economic Yield and at 1.45 p.m. Dr. W.S. Young's topic will be Crop Management for Maximum Economic Yield.

Starting at 2.30 p.m., the speakers' views will be challenged by panelists Don Campbell,

Harold Bradford, Allan Murray, Max Ricker and Phil Hare. Judge Howard Henry's comments will begin at 3.15 p.m.

A new feature of this year's event will be the Junior Farmer and 4-H Program beginning at 8 p.m., Wednesday March 15, consisting of judging classes of corn

and forage, milk grading and home economic classes. D. A. Scott, Department of Lands and Forests, will address the evening session.

Thursday, March 16, chairman Otto Crone will begin the program by introducing a film at 1 p.m. At 1.15 p.m.
