## ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENT

For the year ended December 31, 1971

The Ratepayers of the Corporation of the Township of Walpole, Haldimand County, Ontario

We have examined the records of the Township of Walpole, the Recreation Commission, the Community Halls and the Walpole Rainham Union Public Library for the year ended December 31, 1971 and have prepared statements as set forth in the accompanying index.

The operations of the year resulted in a deficit of \$1,265.89 which with the balance at the beginning of the year resulted in an accumulated surplus at December 31, 1971 of \$187,727.67.

Taxes in arrears have decreased by \$1,470.14 at December 31, 1971 and amount to \$99,231.18 at that date. Collections during 1971 on the current roll amounted to 89.4% of the taxes levied.

Surety bonds in force appear adequate.

We report that in our opinion:

(I) The financial transactions which have come under our notice have been within the powers of the municipality.

(2) The audit has been conducted in accordance with instructions of the Department of Municipal Affairs.

(3) The financial statements present fairly the financial position of the municipality as at December 31, 1971 and the results of its operations for the year ended on that date.
