Cecil Beckerson Honored By Loyal Orange Order

Oct. 9, Erie 128 Loyal Orange Lodge presented one of their veteran Orange Brothers, Cecil Beckerson, with one of the highest honors, Honorary Membership, in recognition of 50 years of loyal participation in the Orange Order.

Mr. Beckerson, residing in Jarvis with his wife, just across the corner of Radical Street from Dr. A.

Lyon's Office, has lived and continues to live a full and interesting life.

He joined Erie L.O.L. 128 in April of 1922, transferred to Garnet Lodge the following year and during the years following ably filled the chair of the Worshipful Master.

He transferred to Waterford L.O.L. 1382 in 1928 where his faithful interest and

participation was recognized in the chair of Worshipful Master of this Primary and in addition as County Master for Norfolk County during 1932 to 1934.

Mr. Beckerson returned to residence in Haldimand County and transferred back to his parent primary Erie 128 in 1947. His wartime service is equally noteworthy.

Orangemen are traditionally loyal to their Christian Faith, the Scriptures, their Country and Commonwealth. Mr. Beckerson's example has been typical of the best of Orangeism. He enlisted March 16, 1916 with the 114th Regiment. He served with distinction as a machine gunner in Haldimand Brock's Rangers. Again early in World War 2 he enlisted
