

## Cabinet Talks Likely On Two-Prices For Flue

SIMCOE (Staff) - A two-price system for support of export tobacco will be given cabinet level consideration, Secretary of State Mitchell Sharp said at a press conference here Tuesday.

Mr. Sharp was appearing with Norfolk-Haldimand Liberal candidate Dr. David Marshall on a brief tour

of Norfolk. He arrived in Tillsonburg and travelled to the Liberal headquarters in Simcoe before attending a press conference at the home of Mr. and Mrs. John Malo, at R.R. 5 Simcoe.

Mr. Sharp said he had first heard of a two-price system for tobacco from Dr. Marshall and had "cross-examined it carefully."

"I think we ought to take a look at it carefully. This proposal has never been before the cabinet for consideration," Mr. Sharp said. He said tobacco growing "has opportunities" for the future in trade with China. "Being first to negotiate for recognition of China certainly did us

## Hagersville OKs Bylaw Amendments On Zoning

HAGERSVILLE (Staff) Council Monday night approved a bylaw amendment that updates the village's zoning and provides for areas of different residential densities.

The zoning amendments have been in the works for some time with the Hagersville planning board giving the amendments approval last month.

Council at Monday's meeting gave the amendments three readings and the amendments will now be sent on to the Ontario Municipal Board for approval. It is likely that the OMB will instruct the village to send zoning

maps to all residents in the village and at some later date, if objections are raised to the zoning, there could be an OMB hearing.

The amendments deal with the density of the residential zones. Formerly, there was no protection in the zoning. See Page 5, Col. 6
