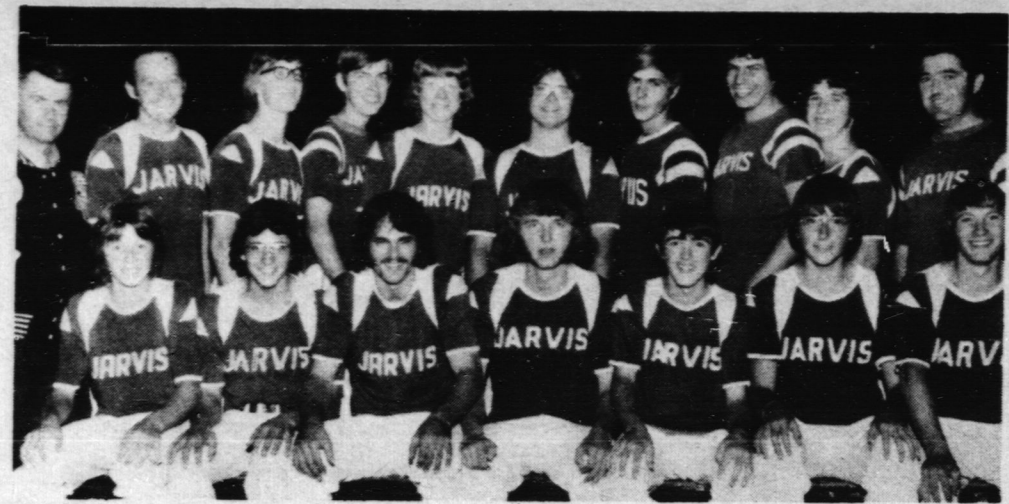


Jarvis Midgets Win ORSA Championship

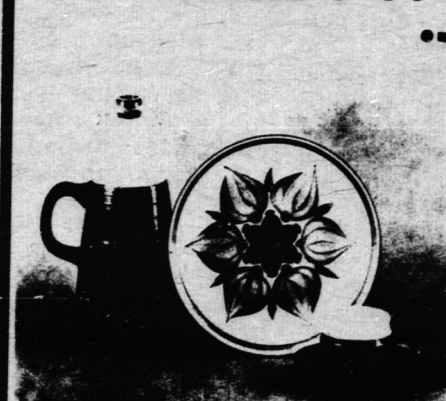

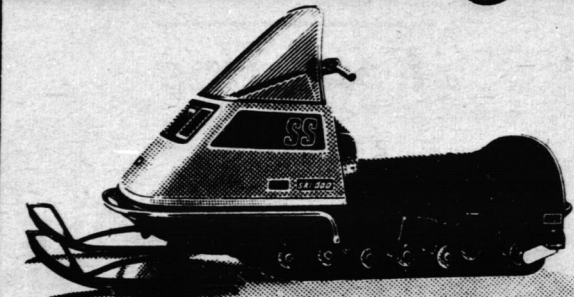
The next game will be played in Cobourg this Saturday night. There will be a bus going to the game for any fans that would like to go.
