News From Knowles
 Spring has arrived earlier than usual in the Ottawa Valley. The ice and snow have all disappeared from the lawns on Parliament Hill. The ice on the Ottawa River directly below my window is beginning to break up. Perhaps it is a little bit of sunshine that has changed the mood in the House of Commons because at last we have got some meaningful legislation put through Parliament.
 The N.D.P. has indicated by words, and shown by their actions, that it intends to support the government on every issue regardless of whether or not it is against its previously enunciated principles. The Creditistes have also supported the government on many votes, although on some occasions they have split and some of them come with the Conservative Party. As for the Conservative Party, the Official Opposition, we have tested the government on a number of occasions to ensure that they do have the confidence of the House. On the other hand, we have actually supported the government when the House met our standards and our criteria.

New Auditor General
 James J. Macdonnell,

ministered in Norfolk-Haldimand. Since many of you have no doubt read the text of my remarks in your local paper, I will not need to repeat my remarks in great detail. However, I should say that I was critical of the tactics used to disqualify people and of the time of the year in which they were doing this. Last and most important I pointed out the effect it was going to have on seasonal labour.
 I am hearing, and many farmers are hearing more frequently, that seasonal workers are not going to be bothered going into the fields to help harvest the crops if they are going to have to have unemployment insurance deducted from their wages and then find themselves unable to collect benefits.
 As a result of this harsh criticism levelled not only by myself but many other Members of Parliament, I am beginning to find some of the persons in my area who have been disqualified now being reinstated for benefits. At least we have had the effect of causing the Benefit Control Officers to take another look at some of the unfair disqualifications. Before I

leave this subject, I should make it perfectly clear that the Benefit Control Officers have a very important role to perform in weeding out the cheaters and the chisellers of the unemployment insurance programme. These are the people who are making the programme so costly to all Canadians.

Haldimand Progressive Conservative Annual Meeting.
 This is advance notice of our Annual Meeting in Haldimand County. Secretary Hugh Slimon of Cayuga informs me that Saturday, May 5th, has been selected as the date for the meeting which will be held in the Cayuga Secondary School. On the recommendation of the executive I have secured Mr. Jim Gillies, M.P. for Don Valley in Toronto, to be the guest speaker. We are fortunate that a man of Jim Gillies stature and expertise in the field of economics should be able to speak to us on this occasion. More about the meeting in the next newsletter.

Toronto's CN Tower
 Construction is under way on a 1,805-foot communications and observations tower in downtown Toronto. It will be the tallest self-supporting structure in the world. Being built by CN Tower Limited, a subsidiary of Canadian National Railways, the tower will have a six-storey sky pod more than 1,100 feet above ground containing observation decks, revolving dining room, broadcasting and transmission facilities, and microwave facilities.
 Visitors will ride to the sky pod in elevators with glass-faced shafts. The CN Tower, scheduled for completion in 1974, will be located in the 190-acre Metro Centre development. It will be one of the engineering and architectural wonders of the world.
