date for the establishment of regional gov-ernment for Haldimand and Norfolk counties was suggested Monday in Toronto by John White, minister of Treasury, Economics and Intergovernmental Affairs.

At separate meetings held in Simcoe and Cayuga on Friday, Norfolk voted 23-14 in favor of January 1st, 1974 for the implementation of regional government, while Haldimand County Council voted 22-8 in favor of July 1st.

"My hope is we can get together on the date," Mr. White said at the annual meeting of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario. He indicated a target date of April 1, 1974 might be accep-
